

Tourney roster growing fast

MORTON – The first anniversary of our first tournament is set for Saturday, Nov. 5 - the 2nd annual Roosevelt Chess Classic. This year's event has already exceeded last year's registration turnout and is on pace for additional growth with just under a week left for more players to sign up.

The early bird deadline expired at 11:59 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 29. Individual players who registered before that time could enter at the \$30 rate while teams could register at \$100. Now, as of midnight Sunday, individuals will pay \$40 and teams will pay \$120.

When the deadline expired, the tournament had registrations for **52** players and **7** teams. This is up from last year's tournament when more than 50 registered, but 46 actually played due to some last minute withdrawals. With more registrations expected based on verbal pledges, and the pace of the registrations received, it is possible the tournament could hit or exceed 60 players.

All of the businesses that sponsored last year's Roosevelt Chess Classic returned and one business was added.


All of the players registered are coming from across Mississippi. It is our hope that as we grow the game in Scott County, future local tournaments will include local residents. Local residents may come to Saturday's tournament at no charge and see what a major chess event looks like, and we encourage you to do so.

State leadership includes SC

The Scott County Chess Club will have a voice at the table of state chess leadership for the next two years.

During the State Championship weekend on Oct. 15/16, the Mississippi Chess Association membership elected Chris Allen Baker, Scott County's Chess Club founder, to the MCA's Board of Directors. Following the meeting of the general membership, the Board of Directors then elected Baker as its Vice-President. Aside from assisting and advising on organization's activities, Baker's focus will be on media and publicity and raising awareness of chess in Mississippi.



SC Chess Club helps Scout earn chess merit badges

On two occasions this year, our club will have helped Scouts earn their chess merit badges through our own event and participating in another one.

On Oct. 8, in recognition of National Chess Day, the club hosted a Chess Merit Badge Clinic at the Forest Baptist Church. While a number of local Scouts already have the badge, four Scouts from across the state including Flowood, Brandon, and Greenville participated. Chris Baker, club coordinator, gave instructions on the game's history and general information while his son, Aaron, taught strategy and tactics.


The Bakers will be at it again in November when they travel to the BSA Winter Camp at Hood Scout Reservation in Hazelhurst to teach the game to more Scouts.

The badge, first introduced in 2011 with help from the St. Louis Chess Club, has become one of the more popular badges among Scouts with more than 250,000 members earning it.



2nd Annual Roosevelt Chess Classic is set

MORTON – The first anniversary of our first tournament is set for **Nov. 5** - the second annual Roosevelt Chess Classic tournament. Like the first one, this event will feature the opportunity for both individuals and teams to participate. It has been streamlined a little based on experience of our first two events.

Our first Roosevelt Classic in 2021 attracted 46 players from around Mississippi and we had players come from Tennessee, Louisiana, and Florida. This year, based on interest expressed so far, an even bigger turnout is possible.

Before we go any further, recognition goes to our past sponsors who generously donated funds to help make our first two tournaments successful. Most of, if not all, of them have expressed an interest to continue this year and we may even have some new sponsors added. This is a tremendous benefit because their contributions help keep the registration fees and expenses as low as possible which means funds left over after all bills are paid can be carried over to the next event. We really appreciate the support from the community and the businesses who have helped make these tournaments possible. We are getting noticed around the state with strong showings of players visiting Scott County to play this great game. There is so much potential to make our community a chess destination in Mississippi.






