St. John Gardens: SAVE APRIL 6TH AT 0900 FOR GARDEN CLEANUP

Calling all gardeners.

It is time again to round up a team of gardeners to clean up the grounds at St. John Church. Experience NOT required \mathfrak{S} , just a willingness to be out in the sun and make things pretty. To do list this Spring:

- Clean beds of sticks, weeds and old dead plants. Regrade as necessary and top dress with an inch of compost (provided). Annual seeds will be spread in select beds at this time.
- Dead head all hydrangeas along the north wall of the church and tidy up. Remove the last of the junipers and remove the landscape cloth at the end of this bed.
- Only tidying up the area around the Chapel because of continuing external construction. (Exterior stone will need washed and concrete still to be poured on walkways and circle drive.)
- Remove the poorest performing roses from the statue bed on the south side of the church and some tidy, low maintenance perennials will be planted. Hope to use donations from members gardens (Hardy Geraniums (Roseanne), Moonbeam Coreopsis, Lavender, Blue or Purple Salvia).

gardener and enhance the appearance of the garden. Gardeners need to maintain their garden sculpture, either weathering them with sealers, etc, or taking them in for the winter season if necessary. Sculpture materials include wood, metal, stone, and more. The Fenton Art Council is one resource if you are looking for a sculptor.

- Summary of 2024 Garden Tour: Amy Doyle, Michelle Kusnier and Patsy Essenmacher chairs. Motion made and carried to raise from \$12 to \$15 with no discounts for advance purchase. Amy will get with Pat Manion to coordinate efforts on setting up the club to process credit card including processing purchases with credit card readers and using barcode software to purchase tickets through the website.
- 2. Discussion on Fenton Arts Council. They have asked OGGC to participate in their spring art day on Sat, May 11 for 6 hours. We would host a table with an art project. No fee will be assessed for this event. Pat Manion is leading the event
- 3. Discussion about a potential bylaw modification stating that members were bring food 2 times a year. A subcommittee from 3 years ago had made that recommendation. It was discovered that a previous board had not approved any changes to Article 3, Section 4 re: bringing in food for meetings and that there is no need for a change. There is no problem requesting that people sign up more than once as some already do.
- 4. Ann Barth will develop some verbiage to be discussed by the board in the future regarding Bylaws Article 3, Section 2 regarding member acceptance.
- 5. Financial: 2023-24 updated financial summary handed out (included 2022-23 information),
 - a. The Finance Committee needs to meet to discuss what is a reasonable amount of money to maintain in club's account.
 - b. Club is continuing to lose purchasing power due to inflation
 - c. OGGC is not recognized by the State of Michigan, and has not filed a 990N for a number of years.
- 6. Discussion about the Fenton Expo. Continue to offer ½ membership rate and ½ Garden Tour Ticket for new people who sign up results from the Expo. Motion was made and carried to continue OGGC at the Expo.
- 7. Kim Alexander presented information on Tour Bus information. Also discussed simply carpooling. Further information will be gathered for a potential "Field Trip"
- 8. Discussion about the speaker program. Speakers need to focus on gardening matters, not just general information about their organization.
- 9. Meeting adjourned at 6:10 p.m.
