
June 18, 2025:

- 1. Pat Manion presented information on Pay Pal for the Garden Tour this summer.
 - a. Effective June 1, PayPal will be on the OGGC website via a QR code.
 - b. Pat will check to see how to get multiple tickets.
 - c. When ticket is paid for on PayPal, the recipient will receive an email with attachment indicating garden addresses, description, etc.
 - d. When guests present their e-ticket at the first garden they visit, they will be entered into the drawing.
 - e. Tickets can also be purchased the day of the event at the Museum.
- 2. Pat Manion presented information about Michigan Garden Club (MGC):
 - a. \$6 dues, per OGGC member (currently around 90) include \$5 for Michigan Garden Club, \$1 for National Garden Club (NGC) https://gardenclub.org/.
 - b. Includes insurance which would eliminate the need for OGGC getting its own insurance (\$300+)

 - g. MGC does not share our personal or financial information with any other entities

7:40 p.m. Speaker Presentation – "Gardening in Harmony"; keeping deer & rabbit out of your garden, presented by the Program Director of Howell Nature Center.

- Repellants include:
 - O Strong smells, i.e. mints, lavender, bee balm, Russian sage
 - o Fuzzy plants, i.e. lamb's ear, astilbe
 - Toxics, i.e. columbine, foxglove, yew
- Barriers: Fences, 8' high...Underground "dig" barriers to repel rabbits, ground hogs, moles, and voles...Tree wraps
- Sights/sounds motion activated sound, lights, or water (i.e. TBVECHI brand)
- "Predators" (reapply after rain or every few weeks):
 - Granular coyote/fox urine (try to use male urine)
 - Coffee grounds (stay away from fragrant grounds i.e. blueberry)
 - Owl statues (move these occasionally)
- Remove nesting spaces (i.e. under decks, piles of wood chips)
- For chipmunks repellant sprays (i.e. cayenne pepper/Dawn dish soap/water mix)
- For tulips deer like these; try growing "smelly" plants around tulips
- Owls (Great Horned, Screech, Barred) are cavity nesters; attracted to red light
