The Defense of Seminary Ridge - July 1st

On July 1, 1863, Union forces made a determined stand along McPherson Ridge during the opening hours of the Battle of Gettysburg. As Confederate troops pressed forward from the west and north, Union infantry and artillery fought stubbornly among the fields, fences, and ridges to stave off their advance. Finally breaking under the withering Confederate fire, the Union forces rallied on the slope along Seminary Ridge. Despite being heavily outnumbered, the Union defenders delayed the Confederate advance, buying critical time for reinforcements to arrive south of town on Cemetery Hill. Smoke covered the ridge as repeated Confederate assaults eventually forced the Union line to withdraw through Gettysburg; the defense of Seminary Ridge helped set the stage for the days that followed.
