DCAMWMW Queen's Rally Guidelines

***Theme: Fulfilling the Lord's joy, that likeminded sisters work together in love
and in the spirit of oneness. Phil. 2:2***

The DCAMWMW Queen's Rally fundraising event will be structured slightly different for the 2021 rally. The guidelines are as follows:

- Each local is asked to have a member of their local to represent them in the competition for the honor of representing our State for the International Queen's Coronation.
- There will be no consecutive yearly representation to provide other sisters an opportunity for participation.
- The local Queen's Rally fundraising competitions will begin after the December 12th Executive Board Meeting and will end February 20, 2021.
- All funds collected must either be turned in to the State Financial Secretary or to their local treasurer *for* receipt and then forwarded to the State Financial Secretary.
- Note: All locals will be expected to contribute \$200 towards this project with or without a local queen's participation.
- The local queen who raises the most money by February 20, 2021 will be declared the winner, crowned at the Rainbow Tea and will represent the State at the International Convention/Queen's Coronation.
- After the crowning at the Rainbow Tea, the DC Queen representative may continue fundraising until June 15, 2021 which is the International's Queens Contest deadline and must provide the collected funds to the State Financial Secretary for distribution to the International Financial Secretary.
- The local winner will receive the gift of paid transportation expenses to the convention as appreciation for representing the State. *Note: If we are still virtual the funds for the transportation will go towards the IAMWMW Queen's Coronation.*
- All funds raised by representatives of the locals will go to the State and to IAMWMW Queen's Coronation.
- All literature and solicitations for support must be approved by the State President prior to release to the public.
