

The following individuals have indicated a willingness to serve on the Barrio Neighborhood Coalition Board for the 2022-2023 term. They are listed in no particular order. The BNC bylaws permit us to have 9 Board members.

Raul Ramirez: I have been involved since the inception of the Barrio Neighborhood Coalition. I also serve on the Menlo Park Neighborhood Association Board, and am the past President of Los Descendientes.

Bill Dupont: I've been a neighborhood rep and activist for 45 years and served as president and v.p. of my neighborhood during that time. I served on the Arizona State Liquor Board as the Neighborhood Rep for the State for over 12 years. I currently serve on the Friends of Tucson Birthplace Place Board.

Angie Quiroz: Co-chair of Pima County Interfaith Council; organized white-collar union for City of Tucson employees; initiated the use of Spanish-Language material; in COT mailings; organized take-back of Barrios Santa Rosa and Barrio Viejo from gentrifiers; board member Barrio Santa Rita Park-West Ochoa; founded Nuestro Barrio for multigenerational families still living in the barrio with the intent of preserving our culture.

Trish Muir is a 4th generation Tucsonan with deep community roots and a long resume of local leadership. She serves as Chair of the Pima Area Labor Federation, on the Executive Council of the Arizona AFL_CIO, and is the Communications Coordinator for Teamsters Local 104. She has experience as a Labor Organizer and has contributed within a committee to negotiate strong collective bargaining agreements for workers. She has served both as a delegate to the Pima Area labor Federation, as well as their Legislative Committee Chair. Beyond organized labor, she serves on the Board of Directors of the United Way of Tucson & Southern Arizona, the Pima County Workforce Investment Board, the Pima County Back to Business Taskforce, the Executive Committee of the Pima County Democratic Party, the Board of the Tucson St. Patrick's day Parade & festival, and is currently serving as the Vice-chair of the Barrio Neighborhood Coalition.

Ellen Murphy is a native Tucsonan, retired bilingual educator, a musician, and a student of Tucson's & Baja Arizona's histories. She lives in the southern part of the city and is active in various ministries of Southside Presbyterian Church."

Glenda Avalos: Originally from Guatemala, her family moved to California when she was a year and a half old. She has lived in Tucson for 23 years. Glenda was introduced to the BNC in June 2020, shortly after taking on the responsibility of establishing social media platforms for the BNC. She created Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and Youtube accounts and has handled these accounts now for over two years, creating/coordinating content and maintaining each. Social media has played an essential role in engaging with the community, especially during the high peaks of Covid. It allowed the BNC to broaden its base within the community as well as contribute to the growth of the BNC membership.

Glenda aims to build relationships which build communities with the purpose to empower, educate, and advocate.

Scott D. Egan is an Irish-American artist, musician and activist who is an elected member of the Barrio Hollywood Neighborhood Association, where he has resided for almost 50 years. He is former chief of staff to two Tucson City Council members and a member of the Pima County Board of Supervisors, as well as a former Grand Marshall in the Tucson Saint Patrick's Day Parade.

Colette Altaffer is a native Tucsonan and community advocate. She has worked for over 25 years on a wide variety of community issues, include zoning, land use code and city procedures. Colette was part of small group of committed citizens who created the Neighborhood Infill Coalition to help educate and train residents on ways to advocate for their neighborhoods. She helped to transition that group to Tucson Residents for Responsive Government (TRRG) to promote transparency and accountability in city government. She joined the Barrio Neighborhood Coalition several years ago and has served on the Core Team for the past year.

Joe Audino has been a member of the Barrio Neighborhood Coalition for several years and has served on the Core Team for the past year. His main focus has been on affordable housing issues.
