Washington, DC, 23 March 2022 — A new study from the International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT) estimates that ships in the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Seaway (GL-SLS) consumed more than 500,000 tonnes of fuel and emitted more than **1.6 million tonnes (Mt)** of CO₂ in 2019.

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The analysis shows that ships in the GL-SLS consumed more than 500,000 tonnes of fuel in 2019 and that led to **approximately 1.6 million tonnes (Mt)** of CO₂ emissions, about two-thirds of which were emitted in U.S. waters.

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
