Empire	Sweet apple with a crisp texture and bright white flesh. Not great for stoage, but excellent for fresh eating.	Cross Pollination required	Mid- Late - season, fruit is ready early October	\$99.00
Yellow Transparent	fruit is bright red, with red strips, excellent for fresh eating, cooking and storage.	Cross Pollination required	Early - Mid Season, fruit ripens late August.	\$99.00
Honeycrisp	Medium to large fruit, cream coloured flesh, very crisp and sweet.	Cross Pollination required	Mid - late season, fruit ripens end of September	\$99.00
Northern Spy	Green-red fruit that is ideal for fresh eating and great for storage. They require another variety for pollination of it, but do not pollinate other apple trees.	Cross Pollination required	Mid-late Seaon, ripens mid-October	\$99.00
MacIntosh	Massive crop of bright red skinned fruit with firm, crisp sweet flesh. Medium to large in size, good for storage, baking and canning.	Cross Pollination required	Mid-late season, fruit ripens late september.	\$99.00
Spartan	Small to medium sized fruit. Flesh has exellent flavour and is crisp. Stores well.	Cross Pollination required	Mid-late season, fruit ripens late september, early october	\$99.00

Fantasia Nectarine	Large, yellow-red fruit, excellent for fresh eating. Should be planted somewhere that is protected from the North Wind as it is a little more tender.	Self Pollinating	Ripens mid-Septemner	\$99.00

Montmorency	Firm red, tart fruit , ideal for pies, canning or freezing.	Self Pollinating	Ripens late July	\$99.00
Bing	Large, firm, sweet, black fruit.	Cross Pollination Required	Ripens mid-late July	\$99.00

Lapin	Dark Red Fruit, that is crack resistant. Makes an excellent polinator.	Cross Pollination Required	Ripens mid-late July	\$99.00
Crimson Passion	Shrub with large fruit that has the highest sugar content. Excellent fresh eating cherry.	Self pollinating	Ripens in late August.	\$40.00
Cherry - 'Athos'	Dwarf Cherry that produces an abundance of dark red cherries with a sweet-tart flavour.	Self pollinating	Ripens in late July	\$40.00
Cherry - 'D'Artagnan	Dwarf Cherry that produces small sour cherries that are sweeter than other varieties. Great for fresh eating, baking or preserves.	Self pollinating and also cross pollinates well with the Romance Series.	Ripens in August	\$40.00

Stanley (European)	Large fruit with dark purple skin and sweet yellow flesh. Freestone.	Somewhat self pollinating, another European plum is recommended.	Ripens end of September.	\$99.00
Italian (European)	Large dark fruit with sweet yellow flesh. Great for fresh eating, jams, jellies and canning. Stores well.	Somewhat self pollinating, another European plum is recommended.	Ripens end of September.	\$99.00
