

Kindergarten Reading Lesson Plan

30-Minute Online Tutoring Session

Lesson Overview

This lesson plan is designed for online tutoring with a kindergarten student to develop early reading skills. The session focuses on phonemic awareness, letter-sound recognition, vocabulary building, and reading comprehension through engaging and interactive activities.

Lesson Objectives

- Recognize and produce the sounds of selected letters.
- Blend sounds to form simple words.
- Identify common sight words.
- Comprehend and respond to a short story.
- Enjoy reading and build confidence in literacy skills.

Materials Needed

- Digital flashcards with letters and sight words
- A short illustrated e-book or story (e.g., "Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?")
- Whiteboard or drawing tool (online application)
- Audio for letter sounds (optional)

Lesson Plan Schedule (30 Minutes)

| Time | Activity | Description |
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| 0:00–0:05 | Welcome & Warm-Up | Greet the student, ask about their day, sing a short alphabet or phonics song together. |
| 0:05–0:10 | Phonemic Awareness | Show letter flashcards, review 3-4 letter sounds. Play a sound blending game (e.g., "What word am I saying? /c/ /a/ /t/"). |
| 0:10–0:15 | Sight Word Practice | Introduce 2-3 common sight words (e.g., "the," |

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| | | "and," "is"). Use digital flashcards and ask the student to read and use the words in a sentence. |
| 0:15–0:25 | Guided Reading | Read a short illustrated story together. Pause to ask questions about the pictures and story ("What do you see? Who is this?"). Encourage the student to read simple repeated phrases or sight words. |
| 0:25–0:28 | Comprehension & Discussion | Ask simple questions about the story: "What happened first? Who was your favorite character?" Use the drawing tool to have the student draw their favorite part. |
| 0:28–0:30 | Review & Closing | Review the letters, sounds, and sight words learned. Praise the student's effort, preview what you'll read next time, say goodbye. |

Tips for Online Engagement

- Keep activities short and interactive to match attention span.
- Use visual aids and props (e.g., puppets, digital stickers) for motivation.
- Encourage student participation by asking questions and allowing them to read aloud.
- Provide positive feedback frequently.

Extension Activities (Optional, if time permits)

- Sight word scavenger hunt (find objects that start with certain sounds in their environment).
- Additional drawing or singing activities related to the story.

This lesson plan is flexible and can be adapted based on the student's reading level and interests.
