Hello, everybody, this is Ron Giles. I'm here with Chris and Holly from New Earth Foundation. And we're going to do some questions and answers today. And so I'll turn the time over to Holly and hope we'll enjoy what is takes place. Thank you.

Thank you, Ron. Thank you, Tracee. And welcome Chris, the my partner with collaborating on the New Earth foundations. I know Tracee, you had a lot of questions from your members on what exactly we do. And they had sent in a whole bunch of questions, but I wanted to give an overview on what our collaboration is. So LWS NEF is designed as a useful helpful practical service to members of both organizations, LWS and NEF have completely different roles and focus, which complement each other. Joining each organization is not compulsory, but voluntary, for those who wish to avail themselves of the other organization services. There's a couple of comments whether any of this Cabal, absolutely not. We we are humanitarians, we have the same vetting process that everybody does. And there is no way that we would be doing what we're doing, if that's what we're aligned with, and nobody is going to pass through this system. On the other side, if you are aligned with that, Chris and I are pure humanitarians at heart, we have nothing other than humanity's best interest and bringing the new vision of how the earth and the projects together to co create on this, this world that we're going to be stepping into. So we are not. With new earth, we're global in nature. There is significant management and risk points which needs to be carefully planned, implemented and manage. Our objective is to remove the headaches from all the humanitarians and have a model put in place. And you could do everything yourself or you can be part of any F will have the models you could take those and do with what you want. You can join the group, be as involved as you want. There's some elderly people that want to just donate and don't want to do projects. So whatever you want to do, it's up to whatever level you're at where you want to go, going forward. So do you want to answer questions? Now, Tracee? Or how do you want to?

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Okay, first question is, when would your program start contacting people, I want to start as CAC with LWS But in any business expertise that I do not possess right now. I want to participate. So I will learn how I believe I would benefit from what you have to offer.

Holly 03:32

So we'll most likely be contacting people 30 to 60 days, once the RV completes, and we're going to launch a new website, along with our new name and branding. And all humanitarians that are registered or registered with any F will be contacted by us by email, with our new website and login details. So the purpose of that why it's going to take some time, we need the funds to build our website and hire the team to launch this right now that we don't have the funds to build the website, what needs to be done. Chris, do you want to add anything on what's involved with building that website?

Chris 04:21

Well, we've already designed a website in terms of the architecture, the functionality and the structure. And we've we have a team on standby to physically build it, that that will take time and it will be rolled out in a stage with a staged approach. And the first stage will be launched 30 to 60 days after the RV commences and that will give the existing members the opportunity of being able to log in, start the feedback to us, you know, what they want, what their objectives are, what involvement they would like whether they, they'd like to collaborate. Now there'll be a whole lot of things Meishan available in stage one, which will be of benefit to members. But the it's a poor, it's going to end up being a portal, it'll be used at an operational level by the by the 12 units that will form NEF, to be able to deliver projects and help people deliver projects. So it's, it's a massive site. And that's why I'm calling it a portal because it will be used by both our staff, by our contractors, and by the humanitarians to access the information required to complete a project. Thank you.

Okay, great. And why don't you guys really quickly talk about how long you have been involved in this humanitarian effort, just so people kind of have a better idea of your background? And don't question our collaboration from a you know, humanitarians perspective. I mean, Holly, you and I have known each other for quite a while, but you've been in the game for how long?

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Holly 06:04

I've been in the RV process for 12 years. And I'm tired, a long time. But as far as the humanitarian, I think I had done an audio this week, you know, it really wasn't a big thing, humanitarian, when I first got involved, it wasn't the focus. But that has morphed and changed through the years, where it's really been gearing people up to shift and become humanitarians. And that's probably been the past, I would say, eight years, the focus has been being humanitarian, doing projects, helping, you know, heal the world, do things for other people, and humanity, don't just get this money and become the new elite, which is really kind of what the focus was when I first got involved. And then, Chris, you've been involved for quite a while as well.

Yeah, in my case, I've been involved just over 20 years. And I became, I became aware of the world situation back in 1983. June and what I was doing professionally back then, and realized that, you know, we're controlled globally by some very evil people. But in terms of the actual RV, and what, what we're involved with now, I became involved in 1999 2000. So for me, it's around 22 years, long time. We're all tired. How about you,

Ron? How long have you been in it?



Ron Giles 07:47

I was back in 2000, when I heard about Nisar and and then the problem back then was the towers were were bombed. And so it wasn't so much a humanitarian it was more of the Tsar that I got introduced to. And then I started writing documents for dinar Chronicles. And that was fun. And then I started doing my own projects and loved ones society is my own project. Until I was it was suggested to me that I start sharing with other people. And in doing so created a website and focused on becoming humanitarians in the way that the Alliance wants people to redeem their bonds in a very specific way. I was one of the first to say that the the Alliance funds are only for humanitarians. And those who are not, humanitarians will not be participating in the redemption process. So it's it's really it's narrowing the gap between those who want just money and those who are really going to do humanitarian work with the plan. So they're being very selective on who they choose and have the money given to so that they can fulfill their callings as humanitarian. So that's been my experience. So maybe the last five, six, maybe seven years is well I have done used getting humanitarians up to speed with my website.

It's going to be global. It's a global, numerous foundations is global. It's not just based in the US.

So, we will be setting up offices in every country. And we our focus will be to have local people staffing each office. So another question I noticed several times where do we speak certain languages etc? The answer will be yes. When we set up an in country office, there will be local people employed, so there will be no language barriers. Okay, perfect.

Next question regarding the collaboration, how will the funding be organized? Will humanitarian still be benefactors? Or will the funds go directly to NEF? Oh, let you answer that

one. Go ahead. Yeah, look, the humanitarians are the benefactors. But there are a number of factors that none of us know yet, which will be the rules put out by the Alliance. So we can't fully answer this question at this point in time. Because that whatever process that we implement, will be with the full cooperation and sign off by the Alliance. But the the humanitarians are the benefactors, none of their thumbs, ice will be coming directly to NEF, they must come via the humanitarian. And, and this again, this is where we see the collaboration with O ws to everybody's benefit, because ultimately, the humanitarian can afford any payments for projects by the old ws platform.

Cool. And will there be any opportunity for the humanitarian who created the project to participate in it?

Absolutely. They can be as involved in the process as they want. It's not. They have to follow what we do. There. There's so many different ways for people to be involved in this. And you know, we want everybody involved. It's a collaboration. It's not just us. I mean, it's many hands make light work. A lot of people on board to pull this off.

we have just a site set up right now, which really is just to capture people's email and name. So when we're ready, then we can upload that into the new website that we're going to do. Like we had said earlier, we don't have the funds right now to do the website and build it the way it needs to be built. And it's going to cost a lot of money to build the website to be this portal. So we're waiting for the funds right now. It's just to capture site so whoever wants to sign up when we're ready to go, we have all their information and then we will streamline it into the new site.

Okay, perfect. And the cost is there a cost for your service? There is no

absolutely free it is. We are doing this to the benefit of everybody else at our own cost. And Chris, you wanted to say something?

No, no just reinforced the there is no cost to join at all. I mean, the project costs for the project or the project costs that the cost to join any F and be part of the service. is free, you can register, there's no cost to register, then you know, then you're part of our, at our team for one of a better word, and you can avail yourself of any of the services that we have.

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Cool? And what if they want to have some of their own employees? Like somebody suggested suggested they had a core team in place already? Or that an idea that they were going to do with some people like locally already? Or can they kind of use a little bit of their professionals and a little bit of yours? How would that work?

Chris 15:41

If the answer is it can work, but we have to look at each case is going to be probably slightly different. So we just have to evaluate each humanitarians individual project, how it how it can be structured to optimize the result, what level of input the humanitarian wants to have, obviously, that particular humanitarian without question wants a deeper level of involvement, or the sound of it. And that's fine. We just need to work with the humanitarian, identify what their needs and wants are, and then develop a project plan that that satisfies them, and ultimately gives the best outcome possible for the project.

Holly 16:25

And just to hit on that, so how NEF came to light is, when I first started hearing about humanitarian, you know, everybody was on that bandwagon, you've got to be a humanitarian, do humanitarian projects, nobody at our level knows how to do or be a humanitarian, we've not done projects of this size. at all, it's not our wheelhouse. And what I had heard for, you know, going back eight years was, you know, there's so many people, I have a water project of, I have a clean, you know, healthy food, organic food, hygiene, hydroponic food, you know, all the different projects that there were, and everybody was going to be doing the same project almost over and over and over. And to me, it was a waste of time, and resources, and everybody's energy, and it wasn't very productive. So my thought was, let's all work together getting model of a project from the ground up, and I have a whole nother partner that has the project management side. And he will assist us in having these projects, how do you build a project from the ground up, that is sustainable globally, and you need all the infrastructure globally, to do these projects, most people don't have that. And that's where this came to my vision of let's all do this together. So we're not all, you know, wasting the same time and energy building the same water project. You know, let's help each other and get this off the ground that much quicker. So that's really what the whole purpose is.

And in addition to that, there are many factors that will influence how a project is is developed. And they are first and foremost at the very front of everything. Privacy and Security, and safety is a major factor. Do humanitarians involved, want to expose themselves that they are, who they are? It's ultimately a lot of it will come back to that. So that some will want to stay in the background somewhere what any involvement at all, many of the people, we've had feedback from, say, look, I've got this great idea. It's X, Y, Zed, can somebody put that together, and I'll provide the funds. So it can be from A to Zed. It can be from one extreme to the other. And that's why I said earlier, we need to look at each individual project in its own right in its own merits. You know, there might be, as Holly just pointed out, 1000 people want you to do the same thing. Well, having 1000 different projects to do the same thing makes no sense. Right? Doesn't optimize things for anyone. So, you know, take one step at a time. Yeah. Let's look at the let's look at what can be done as a collaboration. Some aren't some will be unique. Some will be humanitarian wants total involvement, that they have no issues in terms of exposing themselves. That's fine. Yeah, let's look at each individual one.

So we're not supposed to tell anyone that we are the ones who have these enormous amounts of money. If I am appointed by the Alliance to be as in humanitarian, if I cooperate with NEF and ask them to support me in the implementation of my major projects, then they will know that I have these funds, and I would have given away my identity, or have I misunderstood something here, look,

the only two people who will ultimately know who then who the humanitarians will be the two directors. And we're also humanitarians. And there will be strict, when, as part of the new site, you know, there will be strict privacy rules that we are liable for. So we're not going to go publicizing who you are to anyone, even our staff and project managers, etc. will not know who was funding it, it's none of their business. The design, the design of the architecture of the portal, even will allocate a code to the humanitarian. And that is the code that is used internally of where to draw the funds for a project. It's not the name of humanitarian, that's the benefit of developing a system or portal to do it as a management tool to do all this. So there'll be no public exposure at all, on any humanitarian from our perspective unless a humanitarian specifically states that they want to be exposed, but we certainly will not be, we will not be the ones to do that.

And privacy going forward is paramount for everybody. I mean, you don't want it put out there that you have this beaucoup amount of money and become a, you know, a target at all. So it's really important to uphold everybody safety and security going forward. So if you're involved with us, you're absolutely guaranteed that your identity and your safety and you know who you are, is kept very private.

Okay, awesome. And with that said, that segues into the next question that of several humanitarians have similar projects, and they're together and working with NEF, what is the possibility of them getting to know and share with each other?

And that would be strictly up to each individual? You know, we have, we could say there's a group that has the same project, they might be in the same area. Do you want to work with

other people? would you like to conaborate with them so that you have somebody doing the same thing? So it would be on an individual basis on if they want to be have their information being shared?

Yeah, on our map, our CAC map or working on a messaging feature, so under your handle, you know, which would not be your real name, but under your handle, you can message somebody else that may have a CAC in your area so that you guys can team up if you want, but then that gives the person answering that message. They can ignore it or they can respond so correct. Okay. How does the NEF integrate with our humanitarian qf s accounts? Do we transfer funds into their hands to carry out requests,

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Chris 23:41

any any if at the end of the day, we'll need to have a trust to the funds for projects will filter through because we need to create a very clear audit trail of how and where the funds are used. Because we will I'm sure one of the requirements from the alliance will be to the the management of the funds. And we need to be able to report to them accurately and in a very transparent way. So I just want to reinforce the humanitarians are the benefactors, it is their funds, they will be paying for the projects. I see that coming via the O ws platform, probably ultimately into a trust set up by NEF to hold those funds. And then we disperse payments from that trust. Because as I said, it creates a very clear, transparent audit trail for the Alliance. And remember, everything is from a financial point of view will be tracked by theQFS because that tracks from account to account so there is no room at all for any form of dirty money or some money off. It just can't happen. Otherwise, the queue ifs will literally freeze the account. So right Uh, based on what I've been told, so, you know, the humanitarians Have no fear in terms of where the money is going, because there will be an audit report done and provided to the alliance so that it's very transparent. Okay.

Perfect. Okay, I understand the alliance has project requirements. My question is, does the any F platform meet all of the Alliance's demands for online projects and advice globally?



Chris 25:30

Well, no one, no one knows what the requirements are yet. Correct. No one. And that's exactly why NEF for purpose builders business model to ensure that we're not only fully comply with the large requirements, but NEF actually becomes a preferred supplier for their services for the Alliance. So that's our aim.

Cool. And I want to say that most of the emails that I get the feedback on people are excited because I for 1am going to definitely use your services. I have not had time to even plan

anything on my CAC, other than the building I'm going to purchase. But so I'm definitely going to be using all of your services. So

I'm relieved, are you kidding? And I feel like, based on the emails that I get, everybody's going to need help. You know, well, not everything. But people.



Holly 26:29

They don't know how to do this. Yes,

I think Holly, it'd be fair to say, even you and I are not doing our own projects, we're going to be outsourced to NEF. Absolutely. And we all know we have some massive projects ourselves. Yes, we will not be personally doing it. Yeah.



Ron Giles 26:54

Can I can I make a statement? Please couple of questions ago, somebody was saying that the alliance has certain criteria for a project. And it's not been my experience in communicating with the Alliance, that they have some kind of a format or anything else to judge a person's desires from their heart. And so I don't believe that it's appropriate to say that the alliance would stop somebody from from doing their humanitarian work, if indeed they are humanitarians. They're gonna give their full amount of money if they are humanitarians. And then they can start working with you folks on the New Earth foundation and see how the best way to to implement their projects, loved one society will support those kinds of things with our RSS program and the other things that we have available. And so it's, it's important to realize that the alliance is dealing with humanitarians that will come from their heart, and only those are the kinds of people who will get the funds. So why would they be telling people from their perspective that that's not acceptable or whatever. Besides that, who's who from the alliance is going to tell them? So let's make sure we understand we're dealing with humanitarians here, not not flaky people.

Well, I will add to that, Ron, I get a lot of people ask me, Well, my project be approved by the Alliance's, you know, what is it that it's got to be approved? And what I tell everybody, there's no approval process on your project. You know, if it's from your heart, like you said, it doesn't

have to be a massive global project. It doesn't have to be, you know, anything that's complicated. It could be a simple project, if it's from your heart, and if your heart is aligned to be a humanitarian and wants to do good, and that is what you want to do going forward. That to me, is what this is all about. And there's there's no approval. Do you agree with that?

Ron Giles 29:42

I agree with that. Yes, I agree with that, Holly, and one of the things that why is that question being asked, because they're listening to other to others. That saying if your project is approved, if I approve your A project, then I will fund it. These are the kinds of stuff that is causing a lot of people. They're not getting cancer from it. But there might be getting adults or from it, because they're having their own desires. And they're and if they're true humanitarians don't don't turn your application or don't turn your, your projects over to somebody that has to give approval for it to be funded. That's not appropriate.



Holly 30:37

I agree. And there's a lot of groups out there that have put so much pressure on people to write up their humanitarian projects, and, you know, having them pay them to write humanitarian projects, it just kind of blows my mind, because you don't have to be detailed and organized. And, you know, it doesn't have to be made so complicated.

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Ron Giles 31:07

So you're right, absolutely correct. People who make money doing projects for other people figuring out how to do projects for other people. And that's just, that's that skimming off the top of everything that's supposed to be good.

Yes. Well, unfortunately, there's a lot of people making a lot of money off a lot of people in this whole RV land. And it's pretty sad.



Ron Giles 31:41

Yes, that's true. Okay, we can move on now.



Tracee 31:47

Okay, so the next question is about CAC. And what is your plan to help people implement CAC? Have you thought a little bit about that?



Chris 31:56

It's a fairly simple answer. I mean, building a CAC is the same, you will need to go through the similar process to building any building, which involves planning, the layout of the building, etc. So architects needed building architects, you need interior architects, you know, there'll be a planning process involved, and then you've got the local, potentially local council rules that need to be complied with. So now, again, if people will be able to assist at any level of that, we can do all of that for you, or we can do components of it for you. So again, it comes down to which requirement of each individual person and what their vision is for their CAC. Well, again, I like what Ron said just a while ago, I mean, none of us are here to tell them what to do with their project. We're simply here to facilitate and help them get the best outcome for the project that they have in their vision. So whatever assistance they need, we, we are here to provide that.

May I ask a question? In your, in your program? If I were to come to you and say I have this project? Is there an individual who would be assigned to help me and to coordinate with me? How do you? So one, one for one kind of, or maybe one person could handle two or three, depending on the project? So obviously, what my question would would be, is there one person that I can ask questions to?

Chris 33:50

Yeah, very valid question. The answer is yes. I mean, each project will have a project manager pointed to it, an internal project manager for from NEF. And that person will then coordinate, whatever other team members within NF are required to fulfill that project. But from the humanitarian perspective, they have one communication point within any chef, so they won't have to deal with a dog's breakfast of different people. Simply simply go to one person for everything. I've actually given them that that role, the title of communication manager, okay, so to them for their project. Okay.



Tracee 34:35

Are you satisfied? Yeah. Okay. Okay. Number 58. Okay, the concept appears to be tailored to US culture and business models. My concern is that Asian culture, would it fit the American cultural landscape? How would I follow this model?



Holly 34:57

So NEF is focused on providing systems where the world's best practices are adopted for the delivery of projects. The personnel delivering these projects into each country will generally be

personally appointed by NEF from those countries who have worked in those local cultures and regulations. It's not just for the US, this is global, it will be able to be formatted into any country. Perfect.

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Tracee 35:34

Okay, let's see here. I'm really relocating to be with my family and pursue my projects in Florida. I want my wellness spiritual center to be in the neighborhood where my family and I will be living. If I use services of NEF, how can I assure that this will be granted, and it won't be merged with another med center in a different area?



Chris 36:03

Well, our understanding relating to med beds, our understanding is that absolutely is managed by the Alliance. So it will not be any F or ows or approved methods, it will be the Alliance because you have to go through again, this is my understanding. Currently, if you're going to be involved with med beds, the alliance will be providing training for the humanitarians or the or the benefactors who are funding it. There'll be a separate training for the people who are actually running it. And then there'll be another training session for the staff. So once you're approved for med beds by the Alliance, then that is when we get involved, because you can then either purchase and re redesign or re fit out a building. Or you can start with a clean slate, buy some land and build a whole new med bed center. That's where we can step in and assist.

Awesome, can we conclude that NEF has engineering services to assist in designing agriculture, livestock, poultry, building ventilation systems and other designs for family for excuse me for farming and ranching?



Chris 37:20

Again, a couple of comments around that, within a within the base of humanitarians, there are going to be many with backgrounds that can actually assist in this process. And this is probably a good example. This is a very specific question. And so the person probably has some involvement in that industry currently. So that is where we welcome input from the humanitarian. And they were, they may well know other people who specialize in that particular area that can be utilized back into the project. So again, this is where each case will be done on a case by case basis. If we don't have specific expertise in an area, we will head hunt and identify people that can assist. Because, again, it's about trying to get the best possible outcome for the humanitarian for that project.

Yes, and there's gonna be plenty of people who are gonna want us to hire them to work on all this. Correct? Absolutely. And the next question is about modular and scalable housing. You said that. okav. sorrv. this one is 64. Thev said. how can the number of units of modular homes

be increased by working jointly with like minded humanitarians? And get this out faster? Chris, can we skip that one? Yeah, that's

that's a good question. And I mean, that in itself can become a project for that humanitarian. In other words, how can we help existing businesses that provide products or services scale up to provide increased volume? Well, that just requires funding doing to increase the size of their production plants, for example. So that in itself could become a project for the humanitarian, it may not be directly their current project, but it could be a second project that comes out of the first project. And again, that's just a planning issue. And that, again, that's where we can assist. And I can see many, many instances of where potentially somebody has a great idea, but they're looking at it on a micro level instead of seeing a bigger picture with it. And we can help them scope out and scale up the size of their project, so that their little idea actually helps more people. And I see that a big part of our role

And that's why we started putting the smaller little projects when they didn't give me enough, like, they just give me a list of things, I usually would say, hey, I need more juicy details. But now if they even have a paragraph, I'm putting it up. So then that way, you know, everybody can get more ideas. Everybody has something good to bring to the table. Absolutely. Right. One point and Ron's email today says the alliance will be updated on project progress. Ron says we are not funding projects, but rather humanitarian. So can we kind of clarify that maybe Brian and Chris both or Holly, you guys can all kind of meld that together?

Ron Giles 41:32

I would like to say something about that. I humanitarian goes in. And they may have a list of projects that their intention of doing. And they they say, Well, I'd like this bond, this Zim bond to go for that project, the money for that Zim bond to go to that project, and the money from this young bond to go to another project? And I'm saying no, that's not the way it works. You go in there as a humanitarian, they expect that you already have your, your projects, and are coming from your heart and the implementation of those projects. And that's why they are giving you the funds to you not for the projects. But for you specifically because your projects are not vetted by the humanity or by the Alliance, you are the one that's and if you are qualified and vetted properly, then you'll get your funds, and you'll get to do whatever project you want to do. So they don't fund projects, they fund humanitarians.

Holly 43:00

I agree it's based on the person's heart. It's not based on your project. It's totally based on you. And when you go into your appointment, you and I'm sure you can collaborate on this run, I have been told that there will be somebody at the appointment that can determine their an offworld or or I don't know how you want to describe them, but somebody that can kind of read your consciousness and your heart to see where you are. And it's based on you not anything not your project. It's based on who you are, if you're worthy of getting this because they do not want to fund anybody that's nefarious, or has evil intent, or is not pure part.

Ron Giles 44:03

That's That's correct, Holly, when you go in there, there's a person who will be conducting the interview, and the redemption process. And that individual, it could be an Ascended Master. It could be an archangel. It could be a resurrected being. It could be a lot of different types of people. But it will be individually suited for that individual specifically. In other words, right now as they're preparing all of this stuff and getting ready to do their humanitarian works, that individual is observing them and seeing if, if and being sure that they are humanitarians to be able to give them some funds And so we're talking here about a counselor who will be with them as a humanitarian, for the next 100 years, or whatever it is. And that person will be their counselor so that they can be the best humanitarian they possibly can. That counselor has access to all knowledge and is not restricted to timelines and things like this that the third dimension people are like. So that's a higher dimensional individual that will be the counselors for our humanitarians.

And you don't have to fly over to Germany, every time you don't want to have a meeting with your people, you've got to be smart about this. You got to get your feet wet, like you said. And I think that once you've had your feet wet, you expand and expand and expand in areas that you're already existing. And then there's opportunities that once you really got that down, Pat, you can go to someplace like Africa, or India or any other country. But if you don't have the experience, you're going to have some real serious problems. So we're not entertaining delusions of grandeur, that we're saving the world on an individual basis, we're going to do our part where we can and allow others to do their stuff over in those different countries as well. And then with a map, we can see where people are active. And if we are starting to expand, then we can see on the map locations that would be available for us where they're not being serviced. It's not a matter of saying, Well, I'm here first. Any you can go anywhere you want, set up any CAC where you want to go. But let's just be really smart about this. Delusions of grandeur are oftentimes come from people who have never had money, and then all of a sudden they get the money and they think that money will solve all their problems. And they don't have to do a whole lot. But that's not what's going to happen. And, and so let's let's be sure that we're doing things in a way that is productive. And we can handle it and not let it get out of control. I'll be quiet. No.
