

# Parent Question Companion

## When Business Models Shape Student Outcomes

### Section 1: Governance & Oversight

**Ask:**

- Is the school a nonprofit or for-profit entity?
- Is there a governing board?
- Is the board independent from daily operations?
- How often does the board meet?
- Who evaluates the school leader's performance?
- Is there written documentation outlining governance structure?

**Why this matters:** Oversight protects students, staff, and families when concerns arise.

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### Section 2: Grievance & Complaint Process

**Ask:**

- Is there a written grievance policy?
- If I have a concern about the school leader, who do I contact?
- Is there an escalation pathway beyond administration?
- Are complaints documented?
- What is the expected response timeline?

**Why this matters:** A grievance process should not depend on personal relationships.

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### Section 3: Special Education & Support Services

**Ask:**

- How are accommodations documented?
- Is progress data formally tracked?
- Are intervention plans written and reviewed?
- Who conducts behavioral assessments?
- What happens if my child needs services beyond what the school can provide?
- Are there formal transition plans back to district services if needed?

**Why this matters:** Intentions are important. Infrastructure protects your child long-term.

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## Section 4: Discipline & Due Process

**Ask:**

- Is there a written discipline policy?
- Who makes suspension or removal decisions?
- Is there an appeal process?
- Are discipline decisions reviewed by anyone beyond the administrator?
- How is discipline data tracked?

**Why this matters:** Centralized authority without review can increase inconsistency.

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## Section 5: Teacher Stability & Support

**Ask:**

- What is the teacher turnover rate?
- How long have current teachers been employed?
- Do teachers have planning time?
- Is there instructional coaching?
- Who supports teachers when concerns arise?

**Why this matters:** Teacher stability directly affects student consistency.

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## Section 6: Enrollment & Transition Ethics

**Ask:**

- Does the school have a documented transition plan process?
- How many students have successfully returned to public school?
- How is readiness for transition determined?
- Is progress toward independence regularly reviewed?
- Are families ever advised that another placement may be more appropriate?

**Why this matters:** Every placement should include an entry plan and an exit plan.

## Green Flags

- Independent governing board
- Written grievance process
- Clear documentation practices
- Transparent discipline policy
- Formal data tracking
- Thoughtful transition planning

## Structural Risk Indicators

- No board oversight
- No written complaint process
- “We handle everything internally”
- High teacher turnover
- No documentation of supports
- Discouragement of formal evaluation

## Final Reflection Questions for Parents

- Who checks leadership decisions?
- If something goes wrong, what is my recourse?
- Does this school rely on personality or policy?
- Is my child’s placement being reviewed through data or emotion?
- What safeguards exist if leadership changes?
