
Writing a Literature Review

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The Purpose of a Literature Review

Identify Gaps

Evaluate the current state of knowledge on a topic and identify gaps in the existing research.

Establish Importance

Explain the importance of your research question and how your study adds to the knowledge base.

Find Relevant Resources


Find and select relevant resources on a topic to ensure that your review is comprehensive.

Selecting Relevant Sources




Research Articles

Primary sources that report on new research findings.



Review Articles


Secondary sources that critically evaluate and summarize existing research.



Books

Provide comprehensive coverage of a topic and can include original research.

Evaluating the Quality of Sources



Organizing and Synthesising Research

Introduction

Introduce the research question and provide background information on the topic.

Body

Organize the sources by theme, methodology or chronology.

Conclusion

Summarise the main findings and their implications.

Identify gaps in the existing research and propose future directions for study.

Structure of a Literature Review

Section	Description
Introduction	Introduce the research question and its significance
Body	Organise sources by theme or methodology
Conclusion	Summarise the main findings and identify gaps in the research

Common Mistakes to Avoid

1 Lack of Focus

Ensure that your review is focused on the research question and related topics. Avoid summarising irrelevant studies.

2 Poor Organisation

Organise studies by theme, methodology or chronology to create a coherent narrative. Avoid a list of studies. 3 Inadequate Analysis

Summarise the main findings of each study and critically evaluate the quality of the research.

Avoid a simple summary of the studies.
