Effective leaders always bring a notebook and pen or pencil to a meeting and they take notes.

FORMS & DUE DATES – (It is recommended you keep copies of all forms submitted)

Below is a list of the forms with due dates. It's always best to check with the club's leader to verify the due date for each current year.

Forms are usually available at the club meetings. If forms are not available, at the meetings, Amber may obtain them from the Purdue Cooperative Extension Service Office

ENROLLMENT FORM

(Online January 15th) **ALL** 4-H members must enroll online, along with a \$15 "State 4-H Program Fee" per child. A maximum of three children fees per family will be required. Mini 4-H members are exempt from this fee. This is a state mandated fee to assist Purdue University in the operation of the 4-H program, with 100% of collected fees being used to support the Indiana 4-H programs. Paper enrollments may be accepted at the extension office after the online deadline.

***When completing the enrollment, members will need to check the club of their choosing and their projects. Horse & Pony is a club and a project. The 4-H Extreme Challenge is a separate project from Horse & Pony and must be checked separately on the enrollment form. May 15th is the drop and add deadline for project changes.**

***Members of Horse and Pony MUST attend 3 (three) Horse & Pony Club meetings, 3 (three) clean-ups, 3 (three) workshops or open arena, and complete a demonstration (approved by the Leader), in order to participate in the 4-H Fair Fun show.**

LEASE AGREEMENTS

Lease Agreements MUST be turned in by **April 1st** to the **Advisory Board** for approval. **A lease is when a 4-H member is showing a horse or pony owned by someone other than the 4-H member or immediate family.** All lease agreements must be approved by the advisory board and the 4-H Council. Once approved, lease agreements will be filed with Purdue on May 1st. If a Parent, Grandparent or Guardian owns the equine, then a lease agreement is not necessary.

ANIMAL LOCATION FORM

(Due May 15th). **ALL MEMBERS** must complete an Animal Location form to verify the location where the animal will be located over the duration of the 4-H season. Farm visits may be announced to review housing and animal condition scoring.

ANIMAL SUBSTITUTIONS

No animal substitutions will be allowed after May 15. It is strongly suggested that you sign every animal up for the fair in case your primary animal is unable to come to the fair.

IDENTIFICATION (I.D.) FORM

(Due May 1st). **ALL** members must complete an I.D. Form in 4-HOnline with 2 (two) color photographs showing the face and all 4 legs (close-up). It is the member's responsibility to complete this properly. Members can enroll up to 5 (five) horses, and families can enroll the same horses, but can only take 3 (three) to the fair. Each horse may only be exhibited by 1 (one) member and selection must be made by the horse I.D. date.

PEN CARDS

In order to have stall cards printed and hung prior to arrival, pen cards are due by June 25th.

VACCINATION RECORDS

(Form due on or before May 15th, and prior to any horse activities such as Workshops and Fun Shows which the equine will participate)

***Each equine enrolled is REQUIRED to receive a 5-way (Eastern, Western, Tetanus, Rhino, and Influenza), West Nile, and Rabies equine vaccination to be eligible to be show at the workshop fun show and the 4-H fair. It is recommended but not required, that a Strangles vaccine also be given. A Vaccination Form along with the Veterinarian's receipt or a current receipt of the vaccine purchased (if you administer your own vaccines) is acceptable and will be kept on record. Vaccination forms or copies MUST be brought to all activities which the horse is participating. It is recommended that you keep your original forms at home in a safe place and bring copies of these to each activity where it is required.**

RECORD SHEET - PROJECT SHEET

Members who are bringing a horse to the fair are encouraged to complete records sheets. If a member is not showing a horse at the fair, the project can be completed by submitting the record sheet.

ACHIEVEMENT RECORD

(Due before the end of the county fair) **ALL** members must complete an achievement record. Horse and Pony project members will need to record each placing awarded on trophy show days (usually Monday and Tuesday but may be subject to change), during the 4-H fair, along with all other completed projects, meetings, workshops, etc. Results from the State Fair may be added after completion.

STATE FAIR ENROLLMENT

Online enrollment is from March 1st to July 1st and has a \$15 fee. Late enrollment is accepted with a \$50 late fee. Please see the Indiana State Fair Entry Booklet for additional information regarding state fair entries at www.indianastatefair.com/p/state-fair

Effective leaders have many skills such as listening, communicating, problem-solving, encouraging creativity in others, honesty, and taking accountability for their actions.

POINTS/AWARDS

Members will receive 5 (five) points for their participation at each Horse and Pony designated event and meeting. In order for a member to receive points, they **MUST** sign in at each event or meeting. **It is the member's responsibility to sign in at each meeting and/or event.**

***Points are accumulated throughout the year. The top junior and senior point earners will be presented an award at the Awards Banquet. To be eligible for one of these awards, a member must accumulate 75% of the total points offered. In the past, awards have included: belt buckles, embroidered Carhartt coats, leather award halters, and more. The banquet is most often held towards the end of the year. The Awards Banquet consists of a carry-in dinner for members and their families, presentation of awards and election/voting of the Horse and Pony Advisory board members. Points will continue to accumulate after the fair for open show clean ups. Points are also used for selection of the horse and pony officers.**

MEETINGS/DEMONSTRATIONS

Meetings are generally the 2nd Tuesday of every month (January-November), unless otherwise announced. Sign in begins at 6:45 p.m., with the meeting starting at 7:00 p.m. Meetings are usually held in the Community Building or the Everett Smith Building at the Rochester fairgrounds. Members must be present and participate for a minimum of 30 minutes in order for their attendance to count and to receive points. Members leaving early need to sign out on available forms to earn points. If you are attending another 4-H function on the same night as a meeting, we ask that you sign in and pick up your important information. If you have another 4-H event that conflicts with a 4-H meeting talk with your 4-H leader **prior to the event**.

Members in the Horse & Pony club are required to pay dues. A small fee is paid each year and is set by the members of the club.

Every member **MUST** present a 3-to-5-minute demonstration (may be modified at leader's discretion). Demonstrations given on a designated date (usually the June meeting) are judged and members will earn 5 (five) points if the demonstration is given on that night. Media aids may be used. Please contact your leaders a week prior to demonstrations so that we can provide the necessary media. Demonstrations given other than the designated date will NOT be judged and members ***WILL NOT*** receive 5 (five) points, but will meet the requirement. Demonstrations unrelated to horses are acceptable.

***Members MUST attend 3 Horse & Pony Club meetings, 3 clean-ups, 3 workshops or open arena, and complete a demonstration in order to participate in the fun show during the fair.**

Effective leaders are not afraid to make examples of their own failures and teach others how to avoid the same mistakes they have made.

WORKSHOPS

The purpose of the workshops is to help prepare members for the upcoming 4-H Fair show. Workshops are held at the Fulton County Equestrian Center. Some subjects can include, but are not limited to: showmanship, contesting, western, English, jumping, trail, etc. The first two workshops generally begin in May.

Generally, the Workshop Fun Show consists of 2 (two) consecutive days, usually a Friday and Saturday. After the Friday evening workshop, members are more than welcome to stay overnight in their camper/trailer with a Parent or Guardian.

Beginning at 9:00 a.m., there will be another workshop. Approximately an hour after the morning workshop ends, the fun begins with our Fun Show. There is a small entry fee for the day. This fee is per horse, **NOT** for each class. Members are to dress accordingly for the classes in which they are competing. Boots and helmets are required. Classes will be judged with placings and awards. This is an excellent opportunity to prepare for the fair.

***EVERY MEMBER MUST attend 3 Horse & Pony Club 4-H meetings, 3 Clean-ups, 3 workshops or open arena, and complete a demonstration (approved by the Leader), in order to participate in the 4-H Fair Fun show during the fair.**

CLEAN-UPS/WORKDAYS

***Clean-ups at the equestrian center and club house will give members another way to earn points. They are scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Monday evenings following the weekend of a horse show hosted at the equestrian center, unless otherwise stated. Shows start in May and continue through October. Help is needed after each event. In order to know which Mondays are clean-up days, please check with a leader, get information at club meetings or visit our Facebook or sign up for the Remind app. Points will continue to accumulate after the fair for open show clean-ups.**

Workdays are scheduled to help prepare for the new show season. We need adult volunteers on this day to help run saws, fix bleachers, etc. However, kids are needed too, and they will earn points for performing **meaningful and productive** work.

County Wide Clean-up – Before and after the fair, there are county-wide clean ups. When the work is done, volunteers are fed. Again, more points to earn! Please be sure to sign in!

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES – Based on Interest

With enough interest, the Horse & Pony Club may approve activities for its members to compete in against other Horse & Pony 4-H clubs. Those activities include Groom & Clean, Judging, Horse Bowl and Hippology. For each activity, there will be meetings and practices held at the coach's discretion, with the approval of the leaders. Members can receive more info about these activities at the Horse and Pony club meetings or by calling a leader.

An effective leader can lead from the front as well as from behind and is always encouraging their people to be the best they can possibly be.

FISH FRY FUNDRAISER

***The Horse & Pony Club fish fry is our biggest fundraiser of the year. It's generally held the first Saturday in February of each year, in the Fulton County Community Building at the fairgrounds. Pre-sale tickets will be handed out at the January club meeting. Each member is asked to sell a minimum of 20 tickets. Unsold tickets and money will be turned in Friday evening before the fish fry.**

All members and parents are needed the day of the Fish Fry to make it successful. A schedule will be available for work times and the task assigned for each member. **First year club members will need to contact Leslie Crissinger for your scheduled time.*

Not only is our Fish Fry a great fundraiser for our club, it's also a great way to earn points. Members will receive 5 (five) points for selling 20 or more tickets, bringing desserts, and working the assigned shift. Members who commit and work both shifts will earn a bonus of 5 points for a total of 10 total working points. The Fish Fry alone can earn a member 20 points!

If a member cannot attend the January meeting or does not receive tickets, please contact a club leader.

RULEBOOK – Each family will receive a rulebook.

***All classes are judged according to the rules and guidelines specified in the Indiana Horse and Pony 4-H Handbook at: www.extension.purdue.edu/extmedia/4h/4-h-661-w.pdf.**

The rulebook can be saved and printed. It is recommended that each parent, guardian and club member read the rulebook, become familiar with the basic rules as well as the rules of the specific classes they plan on showing. Many complaints about judging can be avoided by knowing the rules and how each class is judged. This is good horsemanship and good stewardship of the 4-H program.

STALLS

Each member will be assigned a stall for fair week. Equines **MUST** stay all week, with the exception of a sick or hurt horse - only then, if approved by the club leader and/or a veterinarian's evaluation, can an equine leave before the scheduled dismissal.

A tack stall for storing feed, hay and tack may be available. It's recommended all valuable tack be locked up. You may have to purchase your own lock for the gate on your tack stall but if sharing with another member, be sure to share the key or combination.

An effective leader is active in his or her local community, taking active roles in civic organizations that serve the needs of that community.

***It's usually HOT, HOT, HOT during fair week. Horses must have access to fresh clean water at all times. Fans are permitted and encouraged for your equines. All extension cords MUST HAVE a three-prong ground plug. These will be checked.**

***Each stall is required to have at least 1 bag of shavings. Members may bring their own shavings or purchase them at the fairgrounds. STRAW IS NOT ALLOWED.**

ALL empty shavings bags must be disposed of in the designated area or dumpster. Please **DO NOT** put them in the trash cans.

Stalls **MUST** be stripped (all shavings and waste removed) and approved by a board member or leader prior to your equine leaving after the fair.

Members are responsible for keeping their own stalls and aisle clean at all times. Please bring your own supplies. The club will provide a few wheelbarrows for members to use. Each member must dump the wheelbarrow after each use. Please don't let manure sit in the wheelbarrows.

A stall decorating contest is held during the fair. The stall decorating theme will be based on the Costume Class Theme. Stalls can be decorated at the member's own cost and imagination. Please do not use balloons or candles.

***A top Herdsmanship award will be given to the member who has kept the cleanest area and stalls during the week of the 4-H Fair. Stalls will be checked randomly throughout the week.**

Camping with electrical hookup is available during the fair. A small rate does apply. **THIS INCLUDES CAMPERS AND HORSE TRAILERS USING ELECTRIC.** Please contact Julie Moore for more info or to reserve a site.

ALL empty trailers not being used for camping should be parked on the west side of barn near the crop field.

No parking allowed north of the south barns.

All Participants and Members are required to pay \$5 per horse to show in the fun show.

ALL members **MUST** show each of their equines in a halter class (English or western type) at the fair. Please see the Project Summary Guide for classes.

Any member showing in a walk/trot class is **ineligible** to show in any other classes requiring a lope/canter (including contesting classes) of the same show.

ONLY 4-H members can ride and handle horses on Monday and Tuesday. Immediate family can ride after Monday and Tuesday. **4-H members will not be permitted to ride another 4-H member's animal.**

ALL members **MUST** wear a certified riding helmet when mounted or driving and appropriate Western or English boots with at least a ½" heel when riding. No open-toed shoes or flip flops when handling a horse at any time.

NO tank tops or shorts allowed when riding at a 4-H event.

ONLY equines 5 years of age and younger (junior) are permitted to use a bosal or snaffle bit (a bit with no leverage) when showing trail and/or western performance classes.

*Equines **CANNOT** be ridden, bathed, or out of the stall until 6:00 p.m. Sunday. This is for the safety of our members.

***Enrolled MINIS**

Mini members show Wednesday evening. Mini projects may arrive on Wednesday at 4:00 p.m. Classes offered are Showmanship, English or Western Walk Trot Walk Pleasure, Walk Trot Barrels and Costume class. All mini exhibitors must have an adult handler and a separate lead attached. Mini animals may leave after the show on Wednesday or may stay the night and go home Thursday after 10:00 p.m. Mini 4-Hers may not ride their animals outside of their mini show on Wednesday.

Other classes for kids in second grade and under who are not enrolled in mini 4-H are Lead line, Boot Race, Stick Horse Barrels, Flags, and Lead Line. Enrolled mini 4-H kids may show in these classes.

ALL HORSES BROUGHT FOR MINI SHOW MUST HAVE VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

If you still have questions or need help, please do not hesitate to contact one of the leaders. The goal is to make this project a positive learning experience for members and their families.

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Horse and Pony Members:

As a sponsor of these awards, I want to express that the criteria for earning these awards is not set by the club Board or officers, but rather developed and proposed by myself and my fellow award sponsor, Mellisa Steininger. These programs have been very graciously supported by the Board. For their support, we are grateful.


As former Horse and Pony members who benefitted by the 4-H program here in Fulton County in the 80s and 90s, Mellisa and I understand the importance of these programs and how they can benefit members as they work toward their own individual goals personally and within their community. Because these two new award programs are entirely experimental, we kindly ask for parents and members to be patient with us as we learn what criteria works for these programs and what needs to improve moving forward, should these programs be considered in the future. It is our hope that these programs grow, draw in new members, and offer incentives for the kids to further develop their leadership, sportsmanship and horsemanship skills. While we will present these awards to those who have earned them during the year-end awards banquet in November, these two programs are entirely separate from the standard awards that the club will present to the members at the banquet.

We recognize that parents, guardians and members will be excited about these programs that we are offering and will likely have suggestions and their own observations throughout the year. We value everyone's input. Both Mellisa and I are open to discussing those ideas for the future since the criteria for this year has already been established, and there will only be changes to that criteria should it be deemed absolutely necessary.

These programs we offer are not just beneficial for the kids. Parents and guardians are asked to take an active interest in their child's participation and growth through the 4-H program. Kids look to their parents and guardians as leaders, and this is where you can help them. On the following pages, you will find more detailed information about both of these programs. Please keep this packet of information and refer to it throughout the year as a reminder of what we will be awarding at the end of the year. A good place to keep it is on your refrigerator at home!

Excellence in Leadership Challenge

(Separate award from High Point Buckles)

What is awarded:

- One Corriente trophy saddle and buckle each to a Junior member and a Senior member

How the saddle and buckle are earned:

- Throughout the year, we will observe members at club meetings, hosted shows, events, clinics, clean-ups, fundraisers, other in-club events, etc. We are looking for the junior and senior member who best demonstrates positive leadership qualities consistent with the motto of 4-H, practicing genuine sportsmanship and horsemanship, actively learning and developing leadership skills within the club, and encouraging fellow members to do the same. We are looking for members who are positive role models to others, who are goal-oriented, who are mentors to others and those who “go above and beyond.”
- In contrast, we will also be observant of behavior that is negative or that which does not contribute to the positive overall leadership growth of the member. Examples of this could be but are not limited to poor treatment of other members and animals, negative attitudes, not performing meaningful work during a schedule work shift, etc.
- Activities outside of the Horse and Pony Club do not count towards this award. All observations are done only at in-club events and activities. For example: A member signs up to volunteer at a local equestrian charity for a few hours, grooming horses and cleaning stalls and spending time with disabled riders. The volunteer work was not organized or offered by the club, but the member volunteered on their own time. While this is an admirable act of leadership and mentorship which will serve others well, we have no way of observing it, nor verifying its direct impact to the Horse and Pony Club or its members.

Activities within the club count. Examples may include but are not limited to:

- Taking over an extra work shift at a club hosted horse show or fundraising event
- Showing grace and accepting the decisions and opinions of others even if they disagree
- Helping a new member become familiar with how the club operates or introducing them to other members of the club and its officers
- Referring new members who have never been in Fulton County Horse and Pony before
- Offering to help a member with less horsemanship experience a safer way to do something with their horse or pony
- A member who is very good at putting together his or her demonstrations offering to help other members improve their demonstrations
- Offering solutions, being a good listener, putting others first before themselves, etc.

There are many, many examples and ways a member can rise to the challenge of being an exemplary leader and mentor. This is where parents and guardians come in, too. Become a part of your child's development as a leader.

Because this award is not based on points, but rather the member's individual motivation to become a better leader and demonstrate those skills within the Horse and Pony Club, determining winners for this award is entirely subjective, very much like a judge's opinion. We are not capable of witnessing every aspect of a member's participation within the club at all times. Because of this, we ask for your patience and understanding as we work diligently to experiment with this program, and work to improve it year to year, moving forward.

High Point Buckles

(Separate award from the Excellence in Leadership Saddle/Buckle)

What is awarded:

- Corriente Buckles
-

How the buckles are earned:

- **Strictly** based on points earned through the year for attending meetings, helping at fundraisers, clean-ups, etc. It is NOT based on the same factors as the Excellence in Leadership Award.
- Go to the top 2 highest point earning juniors and seniors for a total of 4 buckles (2 per division) based on points tallied and kept by the Board
- Two buckles per division are standard. If there are any ties for first or second, there will not be any tie-breakers. We will purchase additional award buckles for any members who tie for the top two places.

Members may not earn both the Excellence in Leadership Challenge Award and High Point Buckle. May earn either one or the other.
