








Library Update



Multi-Axis Spindle Turning: A Systematic Exploration



Master the art of multi-axis spindle turning! This book offers a strategy for understanding multi-axis turning and the many options available to create unique forms. Dill, a self-professed "experimental turner," takes readers step by step through this complex area of turning. Working in multiple axes on a spindle can be confusing, but as Dill teaches the "hows" of turning spindles as systematic building blocks for future work, turners can finally make this skill their own. Hundreds of photos and diagrams offer detailed guidance, and explain the variables—axis placement, profile, orientation of the new axis to the center axis, and so on—and how they apply to each "quadrant" of multi-axis work. Split and thermed turning methods, planning tips, tricks of the trade, and a three-sided goblet project help you succeed. Concepts come to life as Dill shows examples of not only her work, but the work of other expert turners.

1	α=45°	Q	JS 2 P 65	Standard profile. Only lightly swept back wings. For turners of all skill levels.
2	α=45°	Q	P 65 Hole A	Irish profile. Swept back wings. Swing the tool 180° from side to side.
3	α=40°	Q	JS 2 P 75 Hole A	With long swept back wings. Somewhat aggressive. For professional level turners.
4	α=55°	Q	JS 4 P 65 Hole A	The larger edge angle is beneficial when turning deep bowls.
5	α=60°	2	JS 6 P 75 Hole A	"Ellsworth" shape. Wings are pronounced convex.

1	α=30°	JS 2 P 55 Hole B	For tight spots, detail work and finest finish. For professional level turners.
2	α=45°	JS 2 P 65 Hole A	Standard profile. For turners of all skill levels.

Sk	rews		
1	Straight edges 20° Flat Oval	JS 20° P 65 Hole B	For tight spots, detail work and finest finish. For professional level turners.
2	Straight edges $\alpha = 45^{\circ}$ Flat Oval	JS 20° P 55 Hole B	For broad application. Easier to control than a 30° edge angle.
3	Radius edges	JS 30° P 75 Hole B	For tight spots, detail work and finest finish. For professional level turners.
4	Radius edges α=45° Flat Oval	JS 30° P 65 Hole B	For broad application. Easier to control than a 30° edge angle.

BLIND TURNING PROGRAM

Canadian woodturner Malcolm Zander spoke to the Cascade club at its June 19th meeting about a new program to bring woodturning to the blind in Portland. He has been working with blind turner Andi Sullivan since 2013 to found woodturning programs for the blind and visually impaired in each city where the AAW holds a symposium. Programs have now been established with the local blind organizations in Tampa, Phoenix, Pittsburgh, Atlanta and Kansas City, and they have become very popular. Andi's goal in life is to leave this legacy in the host city after each symposium. You may read more about her in the February 2014 and June 2015 American Woodturner.

At the Portland AAW symposium some 15 visitors from the Oral Hull organization for the blind were taken to the Empty Bowls (which they could handle), visited the Trade Show, had a meeting with a number of turning professionals who brought tactile pieces that could be handled, and finished by each turning a pen to take home (the blanks were drilled and pre-turned - the visitors shaped them further with EasyWood scrapers, then sanded, polished and assembled them).

The Portland program is to be held at the Oral Hull park, near Sandy. Malcolm Introduced Mark Francis, who will begin the instruction. Mark (who is also blind) has taught woodworking to the blind and has done some turning. A mini-lathe has been donated for the program, along with some tools and supplies. The program will be held initially once or twice a month, for a half-day at a time. At the start the blind students make pens, because these are very simple to do, require no prior turning experience, and the blind student gets to take away a pen which s/he has made at the end of the session. This is very rewarding for them.

Malcolm spoke to the Cascade club in order to enlist support for this program from the local chapter(s). It is a wonderful form of community outreach. A supply of wood was promised as were some key-ring holders. Further items which would be of great value are any pen kits or funds to buy them (Gatsbys or Sierras are preferred) plus any used tools or equipment such as a roughing gouge. And most importantly, one or two support instructors for Mark are essential. As mentioned, the time is not onerous at once or twice a month, a half-day at a time.
