


FROM DALE LARSON RE: ELI AVISERA CLASSES



FRESH WOOD ALERT

Hi Guys,

Sending this out to a few members of all three local woodturning clubs as there is a pretty large Cherry tree that is coming down in Vancouver on Tuesday, April 23rd. This isn't a gigantic tree, just very large for a Cherry tree - I understand the largest or 2nd largest in Vancouver.

The owner, Jim, is a friend of mine and contacted me to see about local woodturning club donations. The tree is pretty large for Cherry. It is about 36" in diameter at 5 feet off the ground. The branch that is facing in the photograph is about 22' off the ground. The tree is not completely healthy, which is why it has to come down.



As you can see in the photo, some of the higher branches appear to be dying, there are many smaller burls along the trunk, and there are a few crotches.

I am taking dibs on the first crotch, but everything else is up for grabs for individuals or to be shared with our respective clubs.

The tree is being taken down professionally by a team with a cherry picker (no pun intended), and any wood that is not claimed by club members will be hauled away by the arborist at the end of the day.

I would recommend arriving late morning so we can give the arborist a chance to get started on the tree - we don't know exactly when they will start, but they are doing working on a neighboring yard as well.

Let me know if there is interest in this harvesting.
