5. AVIARY ASSISTANCE REQUEST

Trish Cyrus and Debbie Vasquez were in attendance to request assistance from the City of Seadrift and residents in creating an aviary in Seadrift. Trish Cyrus stated that she currently had 9 birds in her flock and could live to be 100. She continued by saying that her flock cannot be torn apart. Trish Cyrus stated that she was not asking for money, but prayers and support. Trish stated that she had the perfect property to build the aviary, and that it would eventually be converted to a rescue center. Mayor DeForest asked Trish Cyrus what she was looking for the City to do regarding her situation, to which she responded that just prayers, support, and ideas on how to raise money. Mayor DeForest suggested that the City Council could waive permitting fees, not the permits themselves, but just the fees in the future.

MOTION: Alderperson Johnson made the motion to waive the permitting fees associated with the Seadrift Aviary. Alderperson Brigham seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion carried unanimously 4-0.

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RESOLUTION 20230207 FY24 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM PROJECT: K9 UNIT GRANT PROJECT# 4702101

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEADRIFT, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION TO THE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICE (PSO), COMMITMENT OF MATCHING FUNDS, AND DESIGNATING AN AUTHORIZED OFFICIAL.

WHEREAS, the City of Seadrift finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Seadrift, Texas, that the FY24 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program be operated for the 2024 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seadrift agrees to provide applicable matching funds for the said project as required by the Public Safety Office (PSO) grant application; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seadrift agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, the City of Seadrift assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seadrift designates Police Chief Leonard Bermea as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Seadrift approves submission of the grant application for the FY24 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program to the Office of the Governor.
