Mandatory Language for Public Notice Triggered Source Monitoring and Reporting Violation

Ground Water Rule

CITY OF SEADRIFT PWS 0290004 failed to collect the required number of triggered source bacteriological samples for fecal indicator monitoring of the ground water system during SEPT 2014. This monitoring is required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's "Drinking Water Standards" and the federal "Safe Drinking Water Act," Public Law 95-523.
