### THE WINNING TEAM.



The excitement mounted as the leaders in the Whitbread Round the World Yacht Race neared the finishing line in Southampton waters on May 22nd.

It had been neck-and-neck all the way on the last leg from Ft. Lauderdale, Florida (USA), with first "Fisher & Paykel New Zealand" and then "Steinlager 2" taking the lead.

As on the previous five legs of the race, the wind died down as the yachts neared landfall and "Steinlager 2" was able to pull ahead, arriving just two miles in front of "Fisher & Paykel New Zealand" after some 33,000 miles and nearly nine months of fierce competition.

"Steinlager 2" was sponsored by The Shipping Corporation of New Zealand (SCNZ) and the "Fisher & Paykel New Zealand" by ACT(A). Both of the New Zealand entries were designed by internationally recognised expert Bruce Farr, who also is a New Zealander.

As "Steinlager 2" pulled into Ocean Village in Southampton a giant roar went up from the more than 50,000 people who had packed the complex to welcome back the winners. The New Zealand National Anthem blared out over the loudspeakers, a dazzling display of fireworks went off and an estimated 10,000 New Zealanders from all over Britain chanted "Kiwi-

Kiwi-Kiwi" and waved their flags and banners delightedly.

Shortly afterwards, "Fisher & Paykel" arrived and the cheering, chanting and singing broke out again. It was a victorious day for the New Zealanders who had met and conquered the dangerous and varied elements of the world's great oceans.

Peter Blake, Skipper of "Steinlager 2" was jubilant as he held the coveted Whitbread Trophy above his head. He had prepared for the race for two years before it started from Southampton on September 2nd, 1989, and he said that he had been determined to win this time.

The tall (6'4") lanky Aucklander is the only man to have taken part in all five of the Whitbread Races since the event was inaugurated in 1973-74 and he was on "Cloud 9" as he went to meet the world press at the conference organised shortly after his arrival.

A disappointed Grant Dalton, Skipper of Fisher & Paykel, and his crew fought a good fight and can be proud of coming second in this prestigious race. Again and again they led for most of each leg, only to be beaten out by Steinlager.

It was a great day not only for New Zealand and for the two skippers and their crews, but also for SCNZ and ACT(A) and for all those who were part of The Winning Team!


