## PART I: PURPOSE OF THIS COVENANT WITNESS

---

This document applies the covenant standard of Devarim (Deuteronomy) 19:15 — two or three witnesses — to a specific and urgent question raised by the 2026 Iran/Israel/USA war and the simultaneous disruption of the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC):

**Does the war — and the destruction of IMEC — serve the framework of UN Agenda 2030 and the governance architecture built around it?**

The answer requires separating two distinct layers of Agenda 2030 that are rarely distinguished in public discourse:

- LAYER 1 — The Stated Goals (SDGs): The 17 Sustainable Development Goals as written, declaring poverty eradication, zero hunger, clean energy, and peace for all nations by 2030.
- LAYER 2 — The Operative Architecture: The governance infrastructure — the WEF Great Reset, multi-stakeholder public-private partnerships, digital payment systems, and centralized global institutions — that uses the stated goals as moral cover while concentrating economic and political power in entities accountable to no covenant, no nation, and no people.

This covenant witness applies the plumb line of Yahweh's Torah to both layers separately. The verdict on each is different — and the difference is the key to understanding what is actually happening on the earth.

## PART II: WHAT AGENDA 2030 ACTUALLY IS — THE TWO LAYERS

### A. THE STATED FRAMEWORK — 17 SDGs

In September 2015, all 193 United Nations member states adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, establishing 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with 169 specific targets. The stated purposes are:

### B. THE OPERATIVE ARCHITECTURE — WHAT LIES BENEATH

Beneath the stated goals sits a governance architecture documented by its own architects. One scholar described the WEF Great Reset — the mechanism through which Agenda 2030 is operationally advanced — as “the most comprehensive proposal for re-designing global governance since the formulation of the United Nations during World War II.” Its key features:

- Multi-stakeholder public-private partnerships — global governance decisions made jointly by governments and major corporations, replacing democratic accountability with corporate co-governance.
- WEF partner corporations include Saudi Aramco, Shell, Chevron, BP (energy); Unilever, Nestlé, Coca-Cola (food); Facebook, Google, Amazon, Microsoft, Apple (technology);

AstraZeneca, Pfizer, Moderna (pharmaceuticals). These entities both create the crises and offer the solutions.

- Digital payment systems — SDG 17 targets include universal digital financial inclusion, providing the infrastructure for centralized monitoring and control of economic activity.
- Green energy transition — SDG 7 explicitly targets the replacement of fossil-fuel based energy systems with renewable frameworks controlled by the same corporate entities that currently dominate oil.
- Narrative framing: crises (poverty, climate, pandemic, war, food insecurity) are used to justify expanded global governance responses that transfer sovereignty from nations to international bodies.

This is not conspiracy speculation. It is the documented self-description of the WEF Great Reset initiative, cross-referenced against the structural design of the SDG governance framework. The covenant witness does not require hidden documents. The architects published their plans.

## PART III: THE WAR AND IMEC vs. STATED SDG GOALS — LAYER 1 VERDICT

Applying the two-witness standard to each relevant SDG produces the following verified assessment. Data drawn from the UN SDG Progress Report 2025, UNECE Regional SDG Report 2026, Welthungerhilfe, Allianz GI, and the IEA.

**Layer 1 Covenant Summary**

Against the stated goals of Agenda 2030, the war and the IMEC disruption are catastrophic. The war does not help the poor reach 2030 targets. It destroys them. On this layer, the verdict of Yahweh's covenant is unambiguous: this war is a violation of the covenant's call to justice for the poor, the widow, the stranger, and the nations.

## **PART IV: THE WAR AND IMEC vs. THE OPERATIVE ARCHITECTURE — LAYER 2 VERDICT**

---

**This is where the covenant witness must be most precise. The question is not whether the war helps the poor (it does not). The question is: does the crisis produced by the war advance the governance architecture that uses poverty, energy insecurity, and food crisis as the mechanism to expand centralized global control?**

**The answer, verified against confirmed data, is: yes — in four documented ways.**

### **A. THE FOSSIL FUEL TRADE ARCHITECTURE IS DESTROYED — GREEN TRANSITION ACCELERATED**

IMEC was built around the physical movement of goods via oil-powered shipping and rail, with Gulf LNG and fossil fuel trade as its financial engine. Its disruption does not hurt the green transition agenda — it accelerates it. When traditional trade routes collapse, the argument for digital infrastructure, green hydrogen pipelines, and renewable energy corridors intensifies. The Blue Raman digital cable spine — the one IMEC segment still advancing — is precisely the digital infrastructure that Agenda 2030 SDG 9 and SDG 17 target.

Who benefits from the collapse of fossil-fuel trade routes? The same WEF partner corporations that own both the old energy and the new: Shell, BP, Saudi Aramco. They extract record profits at \$105/barrel today while their clean energy subsidiaries position to own the corridors of tomorrow.

### **B. FOOD INSECURITY AND DEPENDENCY — THE COMPLIANCE ARCHITECTURE**

The Hormuz closure has disrupted over 30% of global urea exports. Urea is the primary source of nitrogen fertilizer for global food production. When fertilizer prices surge, food prices follow — on a 12-18 month lag. The nations that cannot feed their people without international assistance become dependent on the institutions that offer relief: IMF structural adjustment programs, WFP digital food distribution systems, and the global financial architecture that requires compliance with SDG governance frameworks in exchange for access.

This is not speculation. The pattern has been documented from the 1970s oil crisis through the COVID-19 pandemic response: each crisis that disrupts food and energy security produces a

governance response that expands the reach of international institutions and reduces the sovereignty of nations. The 2026 crisis is following the same pattern at a larger scale than any prior event.

### C. THE \$1.53 BILLION INSIDER TRADING QUESTION — WHO KNEW?

A Financial Times investigation confirmed that \$580 million in bets on falling oil prices were placed 15 minutes before Trump published his March 23, 2026 statement postponing Iran attacks — causing prices to fall. A second series of bets worth \$950 million on falling oil prices occurred on April 7, again shortly before a two-week ceasefire was announced. Total: \$1.53 billion in trades timed to unpublished presidential decisions.

These trades were not placed by the poor. They were placed by entities with access to information not available to ordinary citizens or markets. This is the operative architecture making itself visible. Yahweh's covenant demands a full accounting: **Devarim (Deuteronomy) 16:19 — do not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise.** Who placed those trades? Who gave them the foreknowledge? What institutions connected the decision-makers to the markets?

Until those questions are answered with two or three witnesses, the covenant witness names it for what it appears to be: the transfer of wealth from the nations to the architects of the crisis.

### D. EXCLUSION BY DESIGN — THE NATIONS LEFT OUTSIDE

IMEC excluded Iran, Turkey, Pakistan, and Egypt by design. These are nations with a combined population exceeding 400 million people. The corridor was not offered to the Muslim world as a pathway to shared prosperity — it was offered as a reward for abandoning resistance to a particular geopolitical architecture. When those nations refused to participate on those terms, the corridor's architects chose war rather than inclusion.

Agenda 2030 SDG 10 declares "Reduced Inequalities" as a goal. But the operative architecture of IMEC and the Abraham Accords framework upon which it depended built inequality into its foundation by conditioning participation on political compliance. This is not Yahweh's standard of justice for the nations. Torah does not permit the withholding of the pathway to life from nations that refuse political loyalty to a particular power.

## PART V: THE TWO-LAYER AUDIT — STATED GOALS VS. OPERATIVE REALITY

## PART VI: THE CORE FINDING — THE MANUFACTURED WOUND

---

The covenant witness of Miqdash Bethel Covenant Institution names the following finding, supported by verified data from the International Energy Agency, the United Nations SDG Progress Reports, the Atlantic Council, ISPI, the Financial Times, CNBC, CBS News, the Deseret News, the Centre for Economic Policy Research, and the Dallas Federal Reserve:

**The war does not help the poor reach 2030 stated goals. It destroys them. But the same crisis is advancing the mechanism of Agenda 2030 — centralized governance, green energy transition, food and energy dependency, the expansion of WEF-aligned public-private partnerships, and the digital infrastructure that enables global financial control. This is not a contradiction. It is the deliberate architecture of crisis capitalism: manufacture the wound, then sell the cure.**

This pattern has a name in the Tanakh. It is the pattern of Pharaoh, who created the conditions of slavery and then offered governance as the solution to the suffering that slavery produced. It is the pattern of the Babylonian economic system described in Yechezkel (Ezekiel) 27-28 — the merchant empire of Tyre that turned the abundance of the earth into instruments of domination over the nations. It is the pattern that Yahweh's prophets named in every generation: those who build systems of extraction under the cover of order.

## PART VII: COVENANT RESPONSE — WHAT YAHWEH REQUIRES

Torah does not permit silence in the face of this witness. The covenant response of Miqdash Bethel Covenant Institution is as follows:

### **1. Name the Architecture**

Agenda 2030 must be seen in its two layers and addressed in both. The stated goals of poverty reduction, food security, and peace are genuine human needs — and they are being used as moral cover for a governance architecture that is not accountable to any nation's people. The nations must be told the difference. That is a covenant obligation, not a political choice.

### **2. Demand the Accounting on the Trades**

The \$1.53 billion in trades timed to presidential policy decisions requires the full weight of Congressional investigation, public disclosure, and covenant accountability. This is not an abstract financial matter. It is the visible fingerprint of the operative architecture making itself known. Yahweh's standard — Devarim 16:19 — demands that those who profit from foreknowledge of decisions that affect the poor be named and held accountable.

### **3. Reject the False Binary**

The nations have been told: accept the Abraham Accords framework and participate in IMEC, or face exclusion and pressure. This is a false binary that Torah cannot ratify. A corridor of trade that requires the abandonment of justice for the Palestinian people, the bombing of Iranian civilians, and the exclusion of the Muslim world from economic participation is not a covenant corridor — it is a Babylonian corridor dressed in infrastructure language. Yahweh's covenant calls for a trade architecture built on justice first, then peace, then prosperity — in that order.

### **4. Bring the Covenant Standard to the Nations**

This covenant witness is transmitted to the leaders of the nations, to the media, and to every person of covenant conscience. The Torah of Yahweh — which speaks to Judaism, Christianity, and Islam from the same source — declares that the earth belongs to Yahweh, that the nations are accountable to Him, and that no empire — Babylonian, Roman, British, American, or globalist — may claim sovereignty over the corridors of trade and the sustenance of the poor without answering to His standard.
