## *Dangerous Personalities in Religious Leadership*

A Report from Personal Experience, Clinical Science, and Torah Discernment

This report is written for those who have trusted a spiritual leader with the most precious thing they possess: their soul. It is written by someone who was there. It is grounded in personal testimony, clinical science, and the ancient standard of Torah discernment. It is not written with bitterness. It is written with love for those still inside, and respect for those who escaped.

*This is not an attack on faith. It is a defense of it. The Tanakh commands: test every prophet by their fruit (Deuteronomy 13 and 18). What you hold in your hands is that test, applied.*

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## **PART ONE: A Witness Account — What I Saw From the Inside**

The author of this report, Elder Kepha (Peter) Arcemont, served within the House of Yahweh in Abilene, Texas from 1987 to 2010 — twenty-three years. He served without salary. He served believing, with a sincere heart, that he was in covenant fellowship grounded in the Word of Yahweh. What he witnessed over those twenty-three years is the foundation of this document.

This testimony is offered not to destroy faith, but to sharpen discernment. If one person reads these words and recognizes the pattern before it destroys their family, the testimony will have served its purpose. It is offered in the spirit of **Ezekiel 3:17** — the watchman who sees danger and does not sound the alarm bears responsibility for what follows.

### **What I Personally Witnessed Under Yisrayl Hawkins**

The following is a summary of patterns the author observed firsthand during 23 years of service inside the House of Yahweh. These are not allegations — they are the record of a witness.

I witnessed the progressive elimination of every voice that could challenge Yisrayl Hawkins. When I arrived in 1987, there were Elders and Judges whose role included accountability. By 2010, all seven Male Judges were dead or expelled. Every Elder who raised a principled objection was eventually removed. What remained was a leadership structure with one voice: his.

I witnessed the financial architecture of dependency. Members tithed approximately 30% of their gross income. Beyond that, we were encouraged to exchange cash for voucher coupons redeemable only at feasts — coupons that expired. Members who left did so with nothing. Hawkins died owning more than 200 properties and \$5 million in assets. I served 23 years and received not a single penny of compensation.

I witnessed the identity erasure. Over 250 members legally changed their surnames to 'Hawkins.' Many members adopted Hebrew names, removing their birth names. The ritual of ear-piercing to a doorpost — a biblical symbol of permanent servitude — was performed literally, as a pledge of submission not to Yahweh, but to Yisrayl. Members were required to declare verbally that they wanted to be 'a slave of Yisrayl Hawkins.'

I witnessed the escalating messianic claims. When I arrived, Hawkins claimed to be one of the Two Witnesses of Revelation 11th Chapter. Over time this became 'the second coming.' Then: 'without sin.' Then: 'I will never die.' By the last years, his own 'Books of Yisrayl' were given equal or greater authority than the Book of Yahweh. Poster-sized photographs of his face adorned the front wall of the sanctuary. The congregation was required to stand when his sons entered a room.

I witnessed the apocalyptic terror used as a retention tool. The predicted dates of nuclear destruction shifted repeatedly — 1990, 1993, 1996, 2003, then September 2006, then June 2007, then June 2008, then 2016, then 2020. Each failure was reframed. Kenyan members built fallout shelters. Families stockpiled seven years of food. The compound was presented as the only place of survival on earth. People stayed because leaving you were considered an outcast and a fall away worthy of the 2nd death.

I witnessed what happens to children. Children worked in the fields, construction, at the slaughterhouse, the printing shop, a cannery, a farm, and other various fields of trades. We were all told they were learning and getting life skills. However, eventually Play was considered a waste of time. Outside education from public school was heavily frowned upon. Outside

medical care was a last resort. In 2003, a 7-year-old girl died when compound midwives performed unauthorized surgery on her infected leg rather than seek medical care. The mother pleaded guilty to criminal negligence. In 2006, my sister in law, Lisa Johnson bled to death after childbirth because her midwife was given instruction by Yisrayl Hawkins to not transport her to the hospital. They just prayed. No one was thought to just disobey his order!

I witnessed the sexual predation that was protected by institutional silence. Elder Yedidiyah Hawkins — the organization's No. 2 leader — sexually assaulted his own 14-year-old stepdaughter beginning when she was 8 years old. When investigators came, the institution's response was to deny, deflect, and protect. He was convicted and sentenced to 30 years in prison. The attorney for his victim stated that the practice of marrying minor females to adult elder males was 'common' within the House of Yahweh, and that leaders 'knew it was happening.'

I received a phone call when Yisrayl Hawkins died on October 8, 2021, at the age of 87 — having declared he would never die. The organization continues to operate. His estate, valued at over \$5 million across more than 200 properties, is currently in legal dispute. No named successor leads the group. The same materials are being streamed. People are still inside.

### Why I Am Speaking

I am not a disgruntled person. I left and eventually found peace in my heart. But the watchman who sees the fire and says nothing is responsible for those who did not escape. I speak because children are still being harmed inside organizations built on this pattern. I speak because the same psychological architecture that operates in Abilene, Texas operates in other organizations under different names. I speak because the Tanakh gave us the standard — test the prophet by the fruit — and too many sincere believers never received the tools to apply that standard.

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## PART TWO: The Clinical Framework — Understanding the Personality Science

The behavior patterns described in this report are not unique to one man or one organization. They are documented, clinically categorized personality configurations that appear consistently across cult leaders, authoritarian religious figures, and destructive spiritual movements

throughout history. Understanding the science allows you to recognize the pattern before it fully develops.

### **Why Religious Settings Are the Most Dangerous Environment for These Personality Types**

Political power operates on the body. Economic power operates on survival. But spiritual authority operates on the soul — a person's eternal identity, their sense of worth before their Creator, and their deepest relationships. When someone with a dark triad personality configuration occupies that position, the harm reaches a depth that no other form of abuse can match. The believer's very desire to be righteous becomes the weapon used against them.

## **The Three Core Profiles**

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Clinical research, most notably Dr. Robert Hare's Psychopathy Checklist-Revised (PCL-R) and Erich Fromm's framework of malignant narcissism, identifies three overlapping personality configurations most commonly documented in destructive religious leaders:

### **1. Narcissistic Personality Disorder (NPD)**

A pervasive pattern of grandiosity, an insatiable need for admiration, and a profound lack of empathy. The narcissist constructs an idealized image of themselves and requires others to confirm it continuously. Any challenge to this image produces rage, retaliation, or devaluation of the challenger. In a religious context, the narcissist frames this dynamic theologically: questioning the leader is equated with questioning Yahweh. This makes normal accountability impossible.

### **2. Antisocial Personality Disorder (ASPD) / Sociopathy**

A sustained pattern of disregard for the rights of others, deceitfulness, manipulation for personal gain, and absence of remorse. The ASPD leader may form genuine bonds with a loyal inner circle while treating everyone outside it as resources to be exploited. Children, women, and economically dependent members are most vulnerable.

### **3. Malignant Narcissism — The Most Dangerous Configuration**

First identified by Erich Fromm, malignant narcissism combines NPD, ASPD, sadism, and paranoia into a single profile. This is the profile most consistently associated with cult leaders who produce catastrophic outcomes. The leader genuinely believes in their own divine selection, exploits followers without remorse, perceives any questioning as persecution, and responds to perceived threat with escalating coercion. When this configuration exists in a religious setting with unlimited authority, the result is predictable: financial exploitation, sexual predation, medical neglect, and the destruction of families.

### **The BITE Model: How Totalistic Control Is Built**

Researcher Steven Hassan's BITE Model identifies four categories of control used by destructive groups: Behavior control (regulating daily life, food, housing, sleep, work), Information control (banning outside media, monitoring communications, producing proprietary scriptures), Thought

control (loading language, thought-terminating clichés, shunning critical thinking), and Emotional control (manipulating fear, guilt, and spiritual terror). The House of Yahweh documented record shows all four operating simultaneously and systematically.

## PART THREE: The Full Profile — Yisrayl Hawkins and the House of Yahweh

What follows is the most complete publicly available clinical and evidentiary portrait of Yisrayl Hawkins, drawn from the author's firsthand witness account, the evidentiary archive at themanbehindthename.com, court records, investigative journalism (ABC News 20/20, CBS News, BBC), expert cult analysis (Rick Ross/Cult Education Institute, Watchman Fellowship, ICSA), and survivor testimonies spanning four decades.

## Survivor Voices: What Former Members Documented

The following accounts are drawn from themanbehindthename.com, court testimony, published memoirs, and documentary records. These are not anonymous allegations — they are named witnesses whose accounts have been corroborated by independent investigation.

### Ariyl Fuentes

Member from age 14; given as a 'virgin bride' at 17 to Elder Yedidiyah Hawkins. Witnessed children working 14-hour days, nearly died in childbirth due to ban on prenatal care, escaped in 1999 with help from a coworker. Her family's \$120,000 food stockpile for the 'tribulation' was lost. Years later she still heard 'voices of condemnation' at Christmas from internalized HOY teaching.

### Claudia Hutchison

Member 10+ years from Massachusetts. Upon leaving: lost children, grandchildren, business, trailer, and food storage. Members blocked her driveway with fallen trees during her escape; she required an armed guard. When she rescued her 81-year-old aunt, the aunt's belongings were burned by members within 10 hours. Five years after leaving, she still ached to see her sons.

### Debby Hopkins

Featured in the 2025 Hulu documentary *How I Escaped My Cult*. A member for nearly 20 years starting in 1993. Witnessed the 2003 death of a child during unauthorized compound surgery. When she tried to leave, her husband physically assaulted her; as she fled by car he chased her and threatened to kill her.

### Kay Hawkins

Yisrayl's ex-wife, excommunicated 1994 after 17 years of marriage. Wrote *The House of Yahweh: My Side of the Story* (2012). Described Hawkins as 'extremely short tempered and violent,' someone who 'screams at those close to him and hurts everyone's feelings without a second thought.' Discovered in 1993 he had been practicing polygamy with his secretary. On Dr. Phil to warn others.

### Margo Hawkins

Yisrayl's own biological daughter. Stated publicly: 'It's a cult. They brainwash people.' Described her father as 'psychotic' and described members living 'a miserable impoverished existence' while their leader 'is worth millions and millions and has at least three palatial homes.' She committed suicide a few years back. Kay said that the mental illness that she suffered from was passed on by her father's side.

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## PART FOUR: The Broader Pattern — This Is Not One Organization's Problem

The personality configuration documented in the House of Yahweh is not unique to it. It appears across traditions, continents, and centuries. The following profiles are offered not to attack any faith, but to demonstrate that no tradition is immune to this pattern. Sincere believers in every tradition have been exploited by leaders who used the sacred language of their faith as the primary tool of control.

### Jim Jones — Peoples Temple

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#### JIM JONES (James Warren Jones, 1931–1978) | Peoples Temple —

## PART FIVE: The Congregation Member's Recognition Guide

You do not need a clinical degree to recognize a dangerous personality in religious leadership. The Torah already gave you the standard: examine the fruit. The following checklist translates that ancient standard into specific, observable warning signs. No single item on this list condemns a leader. A pattern of multiple items — especially when they intensify over time — demands your attention.

<b>TEN WARNING SIGNS IN RELIGIOUS LEADERSHIP</b>
<b>1. Questioning the leader is equated with questioning Yahweh</b> This is the single most dangerous doctrine a religious leader can teach. It makes accountability impossible and removes every internal safeguard. Deuteronomy 13 and 18 explicitly command that every prophet be tested — which means questioning is not rebellion; it is obedience.
<b>2. The leader claims special revelation no one else has received</b> Hawkins claimed only he could unlock the seals. Koresh claimed only he could decode Revelation. Moon claimed he alone completed what Jesus could not. This claim is designed to eliminate every outside standard by which the leader could be evaluated.
<b>3. Leaving the group is framed as leaving Yahweh or forfeiting salvation</b> When departure is made spiritually catastrophic, the leader has converted faith into captivity. Coercion and covenant are opposites. Any genuine covenant relationship must be freely maintained.
<b>4. Financial dependence on the organization</b> When housing, food, income, and social relationships all flow through the leader's control, leaving becomes materially impossible. This is not stewardship — it is economic imprisonment.
<b>5. The leader's personal lifestyle contradicts the standard demanded of members</b> Hawkins accumulated millions while members lived in mold and broken trailers. Jones had drug dependency while demanding members abstain. The fruit of leadership includes the leader's own life.

**6. Children are used as labor, given in marriage, or denied outside education and medical care**

Children cannot consent. Any organization that harms children in the name of doctrine has provided the clearest possible fruit test. This is not a secondary concern — it is the defining evidence.

**7. Dissenting voices are systematically removed from leadership**

Healthy organizations have checks and accountability. When every person who raises a principled question is expelled, what remains is not a purified community — it is an autocracy.

**8. The leader's prophetic record includes failed predictions that are reframed rather than acknowledged**

Deuteronomy 18:22 is explicit: a prophet whose word does not come to pass has not been sent by Yahweh. This is not a harsh standard — it is the Torah's own test.

**9. An escalating pattern of self-exaltation over time**

Many dangerous leaders begin humbly. Watch the trajectory. When claims to authority expand steadily — from teacher, to prophet, to sinless, to messiah, to 'I will never die' — you are watching the clinical escalation of malignant narcissism.

**10. Leaving costs everything: family, community, finances, and identity**

This is the architecture of captivity, not covenant. The Tanakh repeatedly describes Yahweh releasing His people from bondage. No covenant community built on the pattern of Yahweh should be harder to leave than Egypt.

## What Healthy Religious Leadership Looks Like

Every checklist of red flags is incomplete without a positive standard. The following marks of healthy leadership are drawn from the Tanakh's own description of what righteous leadership produces.

### Marks of Trustworthy Leadership

- Welcomes questions, challenges, and accountability — does not equate scrutiny with rebellion
- Prophetic claims are modest and verifiable — failed predictions are acknowledged, not reframed
- Members can leave freely, with their family relationships and finances intact
- Children are protected, educated, and given access to outside medical care without restriction
- The leader's personal lifestyle is consistent with the standard taught to others
- Financial practices are transparent and independently accountable
- Multiple voices hold genuine authority — no single person controls all decisions
- The community produces observable fruit: healing, wholeness, justice, and genuine freedom

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## PART SIX: A Word of Compassion

**Having a personality disorder does not make a person evil.** These configurations frequently develop through childhood trauma, neglect, neurological factors, and environments that rewarded grandiosity and punished vulnerability. The leaders profiled in this report were human beings, and it is so easy to hate them, instead of their disease. The Torah itself affirms that Yahweh desires the turning of the wicked, not their destruction (**Ezekiel 18:23**).

This report does not authorize hatred toward any named person. It does not authorize violence. It does not sanction shunning of current members of any organization. Its singular purpose is to give sincere believers the tools to recognize dangerous patterns before they cause irreversible harm to themselves, their children, and their families.

To those who are currently inside a high-control religious group: you are not weak for having trusted. These organizations are specifically designed to target sincere, spiritually hungry people. Your faith was not the problem. The problem was that your faith was weaponized against you. Recovery is possible. Leaving is possible. Others have done it before you, and they are waiting to help.
