
## EAST TRINITY LODGE HISTORY CORNER

This historical sketch is the 25th article in a series of the history of the East Trinity Lodge. This month we are featuring the lodge's 22th Worshipful Master <u>H. C. Heath</u>.

## **Howell Cobb Heath**

Biography

## Worshipful Master for the East Trinity Lodge (1897)



H. C. Heath

Howell Cobb Heath was born in Kaufman County, Texas on 18 November 1857. The Post Office listed on the 1860 census was Rockwall. Howell's father was John Oswell Heath (42). John, his first wife Martha Jones and daughter Jezabel came to Texas from Kentucky. Martha died and John married Mariah Conner (nee Kern) in 1854. Mariah (33), was born in North Carolina and previously married to John Conner. The other children listed on the 1860 census were Jezabel (14), Adaline (13) Ephraim Charles (9), Martha A. (7), Mariah J. (6), William H. (4) and Howell C. (2), the youngest child. The first three children came from the J.O. Heath & Martha Jones union and the last three came from the John & Mareah union.

The next record we found for Howell was the Texas Marriage Index. He married Lizzie Tregg in Rockwall, Texas on 4 February, 1886. Six years later they are listed on the 1900 census. In 1900, Howell was 42, living in Rockwall and his occupation was Cotton Buyer. His family was his wife, Lizzie B. (28), one daughter Irine (12) and a son John O.S. Heath (6).

Howell's Half-brother, Ephraim C. Heath, was the Worshipful Master of No. 157 for the years 1880, 81, 82, and 84 so he probably encouraged Howell to become a lodge member.

We first found H.C. Heath in the lodge records in 1896. He was 39 years old at that time and he served as Senior Warden. Listed in the lodge records that year were E.C. Heath, serving as Treasurer and J.O. Heath

listed as a Master Mason. This was J.O. Heath's 43<sup>rd</sup> year as a member of the lodge. We believe that Howell lived several years out West in Memphis, Hall County, Texas because there is a record that shows Howell's son, John O. Shepard Heath, was born in Memphis, Texas on 29 January 1894.

In 1897, H.C. Heath became the Worshipful Master and the Lodge Return for this year follows:

In 1897, Howell Cobb Heath became the Worshipful Master of East Trinity Lodge No. 157. During this same year, on 27 December, Howell's father, John Oswell Heath died. More details about John O. Heath's life are in an article published in the East Trinity Newsletter.

Howell C. Heath completed his year as Worshipful Master and then he served as Senior Warden for the year 1898. E.C. Heath was also the Lodge Secretary that year. H.C. Heath and E.C Heath are both listed as Past Masters and J.O. Heath's death is also listed on the 1898 Lodge Return.

In 1899, W.C. Lanham was the Worshipful Master. E.C. Heath is listed as the Secretary and H.C. Heath was the Senior Deacon. Both Heath brothers are listed as Past Masters.

In 1900, E.C. Heath again served as Secretary and both E.C. and H.C. Heath are listed as Past Masters.

The year 1900 was a tragic year for the Heath family. Howell Cobb Heath is listed under "Deaths" on the 1901 Lodge Returns. His findagrave.com entry states he was born on 18 November 1857, died on 2 December 1900 in Dallas, Texas and is buried in the Rockwall Memorial Cemetery. He was just 43 years old.

We found the Heath family plot at the Rockwall Memorial Cemetery on West Rusk Street but we could not find a marker for H.C. Heath. There are tombstones for Howell's father J.O. Heath and his brother E.C. Heath and there is an open space in the bounded plot area so H.C. Heath could be buried there.



Howell's wife, Elizabeth Trigg Heath died on 19 November 1901 and is buried in Rockwall. Their only son John O. Shepard Heath moved to Fort Worth and in 1930 he died and was buried in Rockwall. Their only daughter, Irene Heath White lived in Houston and Abelene, Texas. She died in Abelene, Texas in 1971 and she is buried in Rockwall.

Recently I called at the home of a friend and found his wife reading a Masonic Paper. Since she and her people had long been a bitter anti-Masonic family, I asked her the reason for her change in reading material. She replied she had discovered the grand secret of Masonry; and related to me (the original writer) as follows:

"Soon after you were here last, I learned to my mortification, my husband had become a Mason. I felt it was because of you and I need not say how I felt toward either of you. I at once decided that my domestic happiness had come to an end. Some time later a circumstance occurred that for the first time gave me reason to doubt his integrity. 


