Monument installed near firehouse, wanting to have a ceremony in March/April

Officer Gottman (District 3)

Thefts, Breaking & Entering – no real violent crime to report

Approx 15 new recruits starting February 1st

Gottman is moving on to district 2 – a new neighborhood officer will be assigned

What should we do if ICE is around?

Nothing. They've never had any interaction with ICE and have never worked with them.

Where is the process with listing personal cameras with the police department?

Residents can share access to personal cameras with law enforcement through Axon Fusus platform by signing up on the cincinnati website:

Cameras are not monitored but may be accessed to provide evidence after a crime has occurred. Businesses can have cameras monitored by police 24 hrs at a cost.

South Fairmount Heirloom garden plans have 2 raised beds – adding 4 more

Adding 2 more flower beds – received \$1000 from Seeds of Change

Compost pile will be replaced with bioreactors donated by Healthy Communities

We will want to inform MSD about compostors - visually striking, may come in different sizes

Asking to expand to next lot to add greenhouse

Focus on maximizing the space, using compost will make a good case for expanding

Bioreactor will smell while being filled but not once running

Finished soil will be produced within the year

Composters can be moved if an additional lot is obtained

Will the community be able to participate in composting?

We will need to decide to make it public or not

Public compost bins can be registered on the Make Soil App

How will people know what to compost?

Signage

No animal byproducts - no oil, salt, meat, cheese

Heather (Native Plant Nursery) is working on classes, a S. Fairmount resident is going to run a class on invasive plant identification in May

Concern about Mowing in Lick Run

A fire a few years back may have played a part

Per email to Jill - It was cut back for invasive species control

Pest management chemical treatments only as needed

Can we get community invasive removal to keep from cutting?

A lot of work is needed to keep on top of invasives

Ask MSD to talk to us and get input on what we need to do to reduce their activity

WIN- has teen volunteers available during the week - would need council member to be present
