With great depth and nuance, Minnesota singer-songwriter Barbara Piper beautifully balances emotion and execution with her voice. With three albums of original music spanning several genres, she is a powerhouse of creativity and skill. In addition to serving as a music educator for the Minnesota Public School System for 34 years, Barbara has performed at hundreds of venues throughout the Midwest, including a spotlight performance for the MN Music Coalition. She currently fronts a classic country band called *Lone Rock*, and sings jazz standards in the *Mad Pipes* duo. Barbara's recent notable performances include features with Faribault's Paradise Center for the Arts and Northfield Arts Guild Theater's *CASTastrophe series*.



Singing. acting, directing, producing and interviewing musicians for her radio show, *Musician Talk*, are Pauline's creative pursuits. She recorded an album of originals called *Not One of Many* with the female trio *Dame Station* and played regionally for years with the classic rock and cross-over country group, *Late Arrival*. She's worked with many artists—creative musicians Randy Sabien, Sanford Moore and Lori Dokken are highlights. Pauline is the Performing Arts Manager for the Northfield Arts Guild.



At fieart, Craig is a musician. He plays keyboards and guitar with equal skill, and sings, composes, arranges, and records music. He studied music at Berklee College of Music in Boston. He has performed with national recording artists such as John Hiatt (Capitol Records) and Hal Ketchum (Curb Records), and Grammy award winners Deana Carter (Arista), Shelby Lynne (Capitol), and Larry Carlton (Warner Brothers). Craig's musical talent is a gift he has shared freely. Through his 15 annual *Craig Wasner & Friends Benefit for World Vision* concerts, he raised over \$500,000 from ticket sales and donations.
