Skill Builder: Wilderness Protocol

- If outside repeater coverage, monitor 146.520 MHz simplex on the hour (plus 5 minutes).
- Transmit for 5 minutes, then listen.
- Helps coordinate in rural areas when regular nets are unavailable.

FEMA IS-100, IS-200, IS-700 & IS-800 are highly recommended for all members.
