What is the Livermore Community Hall?

This building was built for and by community members as a gathering place for meetings, entertaining, informing and enjoying one another's company. Volunteers built the hall to last and serve future generations and we hope to continue that tradition. This local treasure is used by both organizations and individuals.

When was the Community Hall built?

In 1946, Earnest and George Roberts donated the land. Seventy years ago, on November 20th, 1948, the hall had it's grand opening. It was a grand event with food, games, prizes, music and a lot of dancing! Community members have always worked hard and are still working diligently to keep it open for all of our residents to enjoy.

Who is responsible for the Livermore Community hall?

The Livermore Community Hall is cared for by volunteer board members. It takes many volunteer hours to keep the business, plumbing, electrical and general maintenance in good order. Bigger projects, such as new windows and roof repair, required help from within the community. Board members have organized concerts, craft fairs and dances as fundraisers to cover the costs of electricity, propane, insurance, and upkeep. The Livermore Woman's Club has donated money for fencing and windows, and has helped keep historic interest alive with photos hung in the hall. The Red Feather Historical Society held a fundraiser to help with the window fund, and Mountain Gals, Glacier Gals, Cherokee Meadows Road Association, and many other individuals have donated funds for various projects. To keep this local treasure in good repair means that there are always expenses. Individuals and groups are welcome to rent the hall for a small donation fee. It has been used for reunions, weddings, memorial services, meetings, education, fine arts events, elementary school pie auctions, and as a command center for local fire departments. Why not come and enjoy the hall and all it offers.
