Escalation: Wyoming AOC Non-Response, ADA Concerns, and Public Access Barriers

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to formally document that the Wyoming Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) has not responded to my public-records request for case-level judicial data, despite multiple attempts and despite the fact that the requested records are public, non-confidential, and already compiled digitally on courthouse terminals.

The AOC's continued silence, combined with its stated position that these records are only accessible on a single physical terminal inside a courthouse, raises serious concerns about transparency, gatekeeping, and compliance with federal accessibility standards.

While Wyoming may have long-term intentions to modernize its court systems and eventually provide this information online, the reality in 2026 is that it does not. Because the data is not available on the internet, there must be a protocol for external access, especially for individuals who are out of state, disabled, medically vulnerable, elderly, financially struggling, working multiple jobs, single parents with limited time, or otherwise unable to physically travel to a courthouse. Without such a protocol, public access becomes conditional on privilege, mobility, and financial means.

This is not transparency. It is gatekeeping masked as accessibility.

Requiring physical presence in a courthouse to view public judicial records is discriminatory. It disproportionately burdens individuals who cannot travel, cannot afford travel, cannot take time off work, or cannot physically access a courthouse. This is inconsistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), which mandates equal access to public services and government information.

Adding exorbitant fees to export or retrieve this data (data that is already digital and readily viewable on a terminal) creates a second barrier. In 2026, charging high fees for basic public records is not a neutral administrative practice; it is another method of restricting access and masking information that should be quickly and easily available to the public.

This lack of accessible public data is precisely why I am forced to escalate this matter. When judicial records are not available online, and when the only access point is a courthouse terminal, it becomes virtually impossible for the public to monitor judicial conduct, identify irregularities, or review patterns in case assignments and outcomes. This environment allows public officials, including judges, to operate without meaningful public oversight.

This concern is part of a broader pattern I have experienced within Wyoming's judicial and administrative systems, including:

- A nine-month delay in obtaining my own 911 call despite being the caller
- Body cam footage that was "lost" that was critical to my case and was under litigation for over a year
- Procedural irregularities now under judicial conduct review
- A Rule 68 fee order issued without proper basis, resulting in thousands of dollars in penalties
- Denial of access to basic public records that should be readily available

Given the public implications, ADA concerns, and the lack of response from the AOC, I am escalating this matter to regional newsrooms, legal institutions, civil rights organizations, and federal oversight bodies. I am prepared to provide full documentation, timelines, and exhibits upon request.

I respectfully request acknowledgment of my data request and a timeline for fulfillment.

Thank you for your time and for sending the initial materials. I appreciate the effort to compile the case lists.

After reviewing the attachments, I wanted to clarify the remaining portion of my original request. The documents provided appear to be screenshots or summary tables of case counts. While helpful for understanding overall volume, they do not contain the underlying data fields needed for the analysis described in my request.

Specifically, my July 2nd request sought compiled outcome data for all closed cases presided over by Judge Westby, including civil, criminal, juvenile, and pro se matters. The requested fields included:

- Filing and closure dates
- Final orders and dispositive rulings (including summary judgment orders)
- Sentencing outcomes
- Fee awards, sanctions, Rule 68 applications, and attorney fee orders
- Appellate activity and outcomes
- Representation status

The materials provided do not include these underlying orders or compiled data fields. The civil dataset also appears to be too large for email attachment, and the juvenile and pro se matters were not included.

To complete the request, I would be grateful if the full compiled datasets and final orders could be provided in a downloadable format. Given the size of the civil records, a secure file transfer location (such as a Dropbox link or other secure download method) may be necessary.

Please let me know if you need any clarification on the fields requested. I appreciate your assistance and look forward to receiving the full data so the analysis can proceed.

Hello Wyoming AOC,

For nearly two months, a Florida resident has attempted to obtain public judicial data from Wyoming (information that is legally public, not sealed, and essential for evaluating judicial conduct). What I received instead were screenshots, delays, misdirection, and silence.

This case is now documented at WyomingAccountability.org, where findings continue to be updated for public review, stakeholders, and oversight bodies.

But the implications extend far beyond one person's experience. Wyoming's current system creates structural barriers that prevent the public from accessing judge-level data, barriers that disproportionately harm:

- people with disabilities
- out-of-state residents
- low-income individuals
- single parents
- people who cannot take time off work
- people who cannot travel during Wyoming's long winter season
- anyone without the ability or resources to physically visit a courthouse

In 2026, when nearly every state provides online access to judicial data, Wyoming's refusal to modernize raises serious ADA, civil-rights, and public-accountability concerns...

How Wyoming's System Blocks Public Access:

1.) ADA Barriers — Physical Travel Required

Wyoming requires the public to physically travel to a courthouse to access judge-level case data.

This excludes:

- wheelchair users
- people with chronic illness
- people with mobility impairments
- people who cannot drive in winter conditions or live out of the state
- people who rely on caregivers
- people who cannot safely or reasonably travel

Public data that is only accessible in person is not accessible.

This is a clear ADA concern.

2.) Economic Barriers — Pay-to-Access Public Records

Wyoming courts have suggested charging export fees for data. Fees that exist only because the data is not available online...

This creates a two-tier system:

- those who can afford the fee get access
- those who cannot are denied public information

Public records cannot depend on ability to pay.

3.) Geographic Barriers — Out-of-State Residents Excluded

If you live outside Wyoming (as I do) the system effectively says:

“You may access public data only if you physically travel here.”

This is not transparency.

This is geographic exclusion.

4.) Practical Barriers — Real-Life Scenarios Wyoming Ignores

What if someone:

- is disabled
- is a single mother with three kids
- cannot take time off work
- cannot afford travel
- lives out of state
- faces dangerous winter roads
- has medical limitations

Wyoming's system provides no alternative.

In 2026, this is indefensible.

5.) Judicial Accountability Barriers — Patterns Hidden by Design

When judge-level data is:

- offline
- fragmented
- non-exportable
- only viewable one case at a time
- only accessible in person

...it becomes nearly impossible for the public to:

- review patterns
- identify disparities
- analyze outcomes
- detect bias
- evaluate consistency
- hold judges accountable

Judges know this.

When public oversight is structurally impossible, judicial behavior becomes insulated from scrutiny, creating a dangerous accountability gap.

6.) Wyoming Is Decades Behind Modern Transparency Standards

Most states now provide:

- online case searches
- judge-level analytics
- downloadable records
- public APIs
- transparency dashboards

Wyoming provides:

- a courthouse terminal
- screenshots
- manual pulls

- weeks-long delays
- no timeline
- no acknowledgement
- no online access

This is not a modern judiciary.

It is a closed system.

Accountability Timeline:

June 3 — Initial Request to Albany County

Albany County received the first request for Judge Westby's civil-case data.

They delayed for weeks, then stated they could not provide the data and redirected the requester to the AOC.

June 3–Late June — Albany County Delay Period

No acknowledgement.

No timeline.

No partial fulfillment.

Only a late admission that they lacked authority.

July 2 — First Request to AOC

July 13 - AOC responded with screenshots after several weeks from first contact, not the requested data fields.

Screenshots are not data.

Screenshots are not exportable.

Screenshots are not compliant.

July 17 — Follow-Up to AOC

A detailed follow-up was sent, including ADA context, public-records basis, and stakeholder CCs.

No response from AOC.

July 17–July 21 — Silence from AOC

No acknowledgement.

No assignment.

No timeline.

No explanation.

AOC silence

There is a particular irony in the possibility that my request may now be reviewed by lawyers within the very Administrative Office of the Courts which is an agency created by the Wyoming Supreme Court itself. The same institution responsible for modernizing judicial administration is simultaneously maintaining a system where public data is locked behind physical courthouse access, inconsistent procedures, and weeks-long silence.

Given this structural conflict, it is entirely reasonable to ask the AOC to at least acknowledge receipt of this email, confirm whether the request has been assigned for review, and outline the next procedural steps. And for accountability purposes, it is appropriate to request a timeline for when the public data will be provided, especially now that the process has exceeded almost two months without a compliant response.

Beyond my individual request, this issue has broader implications for **all Wyoming residents**.

The current system requires physical travel to a courthouse to access public judicial data, imposes discretionary export fees, and provides no statutory response timeline. These conditions disproportionately affect disabled individuals, out-of-state residents, low-income families, single parents, and anyone unable to travel during Wyoming's long winter season. In practice, this means that public data is not equally accessible to the public it is meant to serve.

For transparency and accountability, I respectfully request confirmation that this email has been received, identification of the next procedural steps, and a timeline for when the requested public data will be provided. This clarification is important not only for my records, but for documenting how Wyoming's current process impacts every resident seeking access to public judicial information.

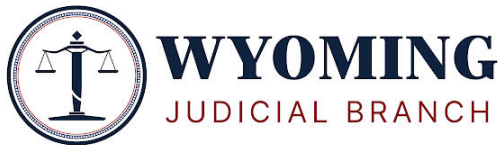

Hello Ms. Butler,

Thank you for your response. I want to clarify the nature of my request so I can ensure it is directed to the correct custodian.

My request is not for specific case records or case files. It is for administrative judge-level data related to Judge Misha Westby's civil caseload, including:

- The list of civil cases assigned to Judge Westby
- Cases involving attorney's fees
- Cases involving Rule 68 offers
- Cases with post-judgment interest
- Any related administrative case-assignment data

These items are administrative data, not case records. They are stored in the statewide judicial database managed by the Administrative Office of the Courts. The screenshots previously provided by AOC confirm that this data exists within your system.

For clarity:

The Albany County Clerk of District Court previously informed me that they cannot export judge-level caseload data and that such requests must be directed to AOC. Their local terminal only allows viewing individual cases one at a time, not generating judge-level reports or lists.

Because of this, I am now receiving contradictory instructions:

- The Clerk's Office directed me to AOC for this data.
- AOC is now directing me back to the Clerk's Office.

To resolve this, I am looping in the Albany County Clerk of District Court so we can determine which office is the correct custodian for judge-level administrative caseload data, and which office has the ability to export or compile it.

If the Clerk's Office does have the ability to generate or export judge-level caseload data, I would appreciate confirmation and guidance on how to obtain it. If not, I would appreciate confirmation from AOC that this administrative data falls under your purview.

Thank you for helping clarify the correct path forward so I can complete this request.

Your July 28th response was sent only to me, and because this request has been handled publicly from the outset (including ADA-related communications) I want to ensure that all parties remain included in the ongoing dialogue.*

Dear Ms. Curran,

Thank you for your July 28th, 2026 response. I appreciate the clarification that the Albany County District Court Clerk is the custodian of the specific case records associated with the Judge Westby Case Dispositions reports provided by the Wyoming Judicial Branch's Administrative Office of the Courts.

I need to address a critical issue in your letter: the request that I individually identify each case and each document. This requirement is impossible for me to fulfill precisely because the underlying public data is not accessible to me. The inability to remotely view, search, or

export judge-level case information is the ADA barrier I have been documenting for nearly two months. The system's design prevents me (and many others) from accessing the very information your office is now requiring in order to process the request.

I also want to address the reference in your letter to potential "reviewing" and "redacting" of records. This is concerning because the data I am requesting is the same data that is currently viewable by any member of the public on the courthouse terminal without redaction.

If redaction is required before exporting the records electronically, that raises serious questions about what information is being displayed on the public terminal and why it is appropriate for in-person viewing but not appropriate for electronic access. Conversely, if the terminal data does not require redaction, then the redaction language appears to be an unnecessary barrier to producing the same information in an accessible format. This contradiction further underscores the ADA accessibility issues inherent in a system that requires physical presence to view unredacted public data but refuses to provide the same data remotely.

I also want to request clarification on the term "bulk request," which appears in your letter but is not defined. Without a clear standard, it is impossible to understand what volume of records, number of cases, file size, or export parameters qualify as "bulk." This lack of definition makes the denial difficult to evaluate and creates an accessibility barrier, because the system's design prevents me from determining how many cases or documents are involved in the Judge Westby dispositions. Additionally, modern case-management systems are designed to export records as readily as they import them, so understanding the specific technical or procedural limits is essential for determining whether this request is being denied based on system capability or policy interpretation.

If Wyoming provided remote access to public judicial data, as most states do, this issue would never have arisen. The lack of online access creates barriers for:

- individuals with disabilities
- pregnant individuals
- single parents
- people with limited income
- out-of-state residents
- people who cannot take time off work
- anyone unable to physically be at a courthouse terminal during limited weekday hours

Even for those who can appear in person, the current system does not allow exporting or printing judge-level data for analysis, which raises significant concerns about judicial transparency and public oversight. These concerns are shared by several of the stakeholders copied on this correspondence.

Your letter confirms that the Clerk's Office is the custodian of the underlying case records. The AOC's July 13th communication confirms that the judge-level data exists in compiled form. Yet the system's design prevents the public from accessing that data in any meaningful or ADA-compliant way. Requiring me to identify each case individually when the system itself prevents me from viewing or retrieving those case numbers creates an accessibility barrier that is inseparable from the ADA concerns I have raised.

To move this forward in a way that is workable for your office and compliant with ADA obligations, I am requesting a reasonable accommodation: that the Clerk's Office provide electronic access to the records associated with the cases listed in the Judge Westby Case Dispositions reports, without requiring in-person inspection or individualized case-by-case identification.

If the Clerk's Office is unable to provide the records in the format requested, please confirm whether the Clerk can provide:

- A complete list of case numbers associated with Judge Westby's civil dispositions from August 2022 to present, as reflected in the AOC reports.
- A confirmation of which of those cases contain summary judgment orders, Rule 68 filings, or post-judgment interest orders.

This information would allow me to submit a more granular request without imposing unreasonable burden on the Clerk's Office and without requiring in-person inspection, which is not accessible to me.

I also request clarification on the fee structure referenced in your letter. Specifically, please confirm:

- The hourly rate for electronic record retrieval and review.
- Whether fees can be waived or reduced when the request is made as part of an ADA accommodation.

For planning purposes, please also confirm the format in which electronic records are typically exported (PDF, TIFF, native CMS format, or another standard), and the method by which they are delivered to remote requesters. This information is necessary to understand the accessibility of the records and to ensure that any accommodation provided is usable for individuals who cannot appear in person.

I remain committed to working collaboratively and professionally to obtain the records that the AOC has already identified and that your office has confirmed are within the Clerk's custodianship. Please advise on the next steps that comply with both Wyoming's Public Records Act and ADA requirements.

Your August 3rd response was again sent offline and this time through an encrypted Barracuda portal, which prevents forwarding, archiving, or public access. Because this request concerns public judicial records and ADA accessibility issues, encrypted delivery raises significant transparency concerns and requires that the response be re-shared here so all stakeholders can review it.*

Dear Ms. Curran,

Thank you for your August 3rd, 2026 response. I appreciate the continued engagement, but your letter leaves several critical issues unresolved and introduces new contradictions that must be addressed for this request to proceed lawfully and in an ADA-compliant manner.

1. Encrypted delivery of a public records denial is inappropriate and concerning.

Your August 3rd response was sent through Barracuda's encrypted portal, which:

- prevents forwarding
- prevents archiving in Gmail
- prevents public oversight
- prevents copied stakeholders from seeing the response

For a public records request (especially one involving ADA accessibility concerns) encrypted delivery is highly unusual and creates the appearance of limiting transparency. If the content is appropriate for public release, it should not be encrypted.

2. Your denial again mischaracterizes my request as "bulk," despite the AOC already providing the case list.

Your letter states:

"Without the specificity outlined in my July 28th response, the Clerk remains unable to fulfill your request."

However:

The AOC already provided the full list of case numbers in the Judge Westby Case Dispositions reports.

I already specified the exact document types requested:

- • summary judgments
- • Rule 68 judgments
- • underlying case data

These are existing documents tied to specific cases. No “bulk extraction” is required.

Your denial relies on §16-4-202(d)(iii), which prohibits requiring a governmental entity to compile or extract data. But I am not requesting compiled or extracted data only existing case records.

This statute does not apply to my request.

3. Your response again fails to address ADA accessibility barriers.

Your August 3rd letter does not acknowledge:

- my ADA accommodation request
- my inability to inspect records in person
- the requirement for electronic access
- the ADA’s mandate for reasonable accommodation
- the contradiction between unredacted terminal access and restricted electronic access

This is the second consecutive response that omits ADA entirely.

4. Your response does not address the redaction contradiction raised in my July 28th rebuttal.

Your July 28th letter referenced:

- “reviewing”
- “redacting”
- “formatting”
- “converting”

Yet the same data is viewable unredacted on the courthouse terminal.

Your August 3rd letter does not explain:

- whether redaction is required
- why unredacted data is available in person but not electronically
- whether redaction fees apply
- whether redaction is being used as a barrier to electronic access

This contradiction remains unresolved.

5. Your response does not provide the fee information required to evaluate the request.

You referenced Resolution 2017-008 but did not provide:

- the hourly rate for electronic retrieval

- whether redaction time is billed
- whether ADA accommodations reduce or waive fees
- whether fees differ for electronic vs. physical access

This information is essential for determining whether the request is financially accessible and ADA-compliant.

6. Your response does not identify the format or delivery method for electronic records.

Please confirm:

- whether records are provided as PDF, TIFF, native CMS export, or another format
- whether records are delivered via email, secure portal, file transfer, or physical media

This information is necessary to determine whether the accommodation is usable for individuals who cannot appear in person.

7. Your response does not address the accessibility barrier created by requiring me to individually identify case numbers that the system prevents me from viewing.

Your letter states that I must identify:

- each case
- each document

But the system's design prevents me from:

- remotely viewing judge-level case lists
- exporting case numbers
- accessing the underlying data

This is the ADA barrier I have been documenting for now two months.

Requiring me to identify case numbers that the system itself prevents me from accessing is not a reasonable requirement.

To move this forward, I am requesting the following clarifications:

A. Fee Structure

Please confirm:

- hourly rate for electronic retrieval
- whether redaction time is billed
- whether ADA accommodations reduce or waive fees
- whether fees differ for electronic vs. physical access

B. Record Format

Please confirm whether electronic records are provided as:

- PDF
- TIFF
- native CMS export
- scanned images
- another standard format

C. Delivery Method

Please confirm whether electronic records are delivered via:

- email
- secure portal
- file transfer
- physical media

D. Redaction Requirements

Please confirm:

- whether redaction is required
- why unredacted data is available on the terminal but not electronically
- whether redaction fees apply

E. ADA Accommodation

Please confirm whether the Clerk's Office intends to provide electronic access as a reasonable accommodation.

If not, please cite the legal basis for denying an ADA accommodation.

Requested Next Steps:

To proceed in a way that is workable for your office and compliant with ADA obligations, I am requesting:

1. Electronic access to the records associated with the cases listed in the AOC's Judge Westby Case Dispositions reports.
2. If electronic access cannot be provided, please provide:
 - a complete list of case numbers associated with Judge Westby's civil dispositions (August 2022–present)
 - confirmation of which cases contain summary judgments, Rule 68 filings, or post-judgment interest orders

This information will allow me to submit a more granular request without imposing unreasonable burden on the Clerk's Office and without requiring in-person inspection.

Thank you for your time and attention. I remain committed to working collaboratively and professionally to obtain the records that the AOC has already identified and that your office has confirmed are within the Clerk's custodianship.

Hello Ms. Curran,

I am writing to follow up on my August 4th response to your August 3rd message, which stated that my records request was considered "closed." It has now been one week with no reply from anyone on the CC list.

To reiterate: my original request was for **existing Case Records**, not compiled data. The items I requested are expressly defined as accessible public Case Records under the Wyoming Rules Governing Access to Court Records. These include:

- Summary judgments
- Rule 68 offers of judgment and any resulting fee awards
- Orders imposing attorney's fees or sanctions
- Post-judgment interest determinations
- Any related docket entries necessary to identify and obtain the above

Your August 3rd letter cited §16-4-202(d)(iii), but that provision applies only to **newly created compilations**, not to existing judicial records. The Rules Governing Access to Court Records make clear that:

- Case Records are presumptively open to the public
- Clerks must provide access in a reasonably accessible format
- Fees, timelines, and vendor details must be disclosed upon request

None of these required procedural steps were provided. Instead, the response created a circular barrier: I was told I must provide case numbers, while the only terminal containing those case numbers is inaccessible to me. That is not a lawful limitation under the Rules.

Additionally, the August 3rd message was encrypted despite containing information subject to public disclosure. This contradicts the requirement that public records be provided in an accessible format.

Given the above, I am requesting that this records request be **reopened** and processed according to the Wyoming Rules Governing Access to Court Records. I also ask for confirmation that all future communication will continue with the full CC list included.

Please confirm receipt and provide an updated timeline for fulfilling the request.
