#1 Disaster Preparedness

Hazard & Risk. Hazard Mitigation, CERT disaster response

#2 CERT Organization

CERT Organization, command structure, decision-making; documentation; radio communication; tabletop exercises.

#3 Emergency Medical-Part I

Recognizing and treating life threatening conditions, triage.

#4 Emergency Medical-Part II

Disaster medical operations, head-to-toe assessment; first aid and medical treatment, public health considerations.

#5 Disaster Psychology

Team well-being, working with survivors

#6 Fire

Fire chemistry, hazardous materials, "Sizing up", safety, fire suppression.

#7 Light Search and Rescue Ops

Planning; sizing-up, conducting search & rescue; cribbing techniques.

#8 Terrorism and CERT

Defining and identifying terrorism, CBRNE indicators, active shooter events.

#9 Disaster Simulation

Exercise critique, summary, and Certificates of Completion.

CERT Training provides you with the knowledge and skills to prepare for and properly respond to an emergency impacting yourself, your family, and/or your community.

How Does CERT benefit your community?

Those individuals who complete CERT training gain a clear understanding of the potential threats to their home, workplace, and community and more importantly know what steps need to be taken to properly respond to an emergency to lessen the effects to life and property caused by hazards.

Responding to a major disaster could overwhelm local response capabilities. **Applying CERT** knowledge and skills learned in the classroom and reinforced through hands-on drills and exercise will enable individuals and communities to address immediate needs until professional responders arrive. When help does arrive, CERTs responder efforts support by providing timely and important information to responders. CERTs also support and work on nonprojects emergency that help improve emergency preparedness in their community or support volunteer activities at major events.

Why is CERT Important?

CERT training promotes partnering emergency between response agencies and the communities they serve. As resources are limited, building Community Resilience is the key to effective response and quicker recovery. As Hawai'i is the most isolated populated island chain in the world, as 11 of the world's 13 climate zones are found on Hawaii Island, and as Hawai'i County is #1 out of the 3,143 counties in the USA for the potential to be impacted by hazards, you need to be prepared. Partnering with emergency response agencies and your community through the CERT Program will help build Community Resilience.

After completing CERT training, you find your newly acquired knowledge and skills useful for yourself and your family; should the need arise. What's more, you may want to form or join an existing CERT Team in your community. For more information on forming or joining a CERT Team, please ask our CERT

instructor. CERT Team members maintain and refine their skills by participating in exercises and other organized activities. They can supplemental attend training opportunities offered by Hawaii Civil County Defense and supporting organizations to further their knowledge and skills. Finally, CERT members can volunteer and participate in projects that improve their community.
