2026 ROAD ASSESSMENT FEE

The Board of Directors have voted to keep the maintenance fee the same as 2025. \$155.00 per year and still offer the early payment discount, if your maintenance is paid by Feb. 28th the assessment fee is \$145.00. With this being said...

VOTING INSIGHT


The RMC Bylaws specify the percentage of returns needed to pass any issue that is on the Ballot. Ballots received must equal at least 10% of the votes entitled to be cast when voting on the Road Plan, Election of Officers, and the Budget. Any Changes to the Bylaws requires 15% of the votes entitled to be cast.

OUR PAVING PROCESS

Chipseal's are constructed by evenly distributing a thin base of hot tar, bitumen or asphalt onto an existing pavement and then embedding finely graded aggregate into it. The aggregate is evenly distributed over the hot seal spray, then rolled into the bitumen using heavy rubber-tired rollers creating a paved surface. A chip-seal-surfaced pavement can optionally be sealed with a top layer, which is referred to as a fog seal or enrichment. Chipseal is typically used on rural Roads

IMPORTANT: Vehicle speed can affect the set-up time with chipseal. Depending on weather conditions, the set speed for chipseal is 10-15 miles per hour for the first 24-48 hours after construction.

- Drive Slowly on freshly chipped or oiled roads.
- Be Aware of Workers on Foot
- Give Workers Plenty of Space
- Follow Flaggers' Instructions
- Use Caution Around Heavy Equipment
- Stay Clear of Construction Equipment
- Be Prepared for Equipment to Move
- Be Prepared for Changes in Road Conditions
- Stay Calm and Be Patient

This past year, while doing road work, our crew has witnessed a lot of disregards to posted signs and flaggers. Drivers intentionally drive fast on freshly oiled roads, running over and destroying signs and showing disrespect. **Show Aloha**. Take a different route; it won't take but a few more minutes. If you're not sure what to do, simply ask. Here are a few reminders...

To stay safe in construction areas, it's crucial to slow down and stick to the posted speed limit. Although it may be tempting to speed up and get through the construction zone quickly, doing so can put you and others at risk. Remember that construction zones are often congested with workers, large vehicles, and equipment, so it's important to take extra precautions. Please watch for road workers!

2026 ROAD PLAN

Our goal is to resurface 15 miles of roadway each year. That will complete the subdivision every 10 years. Typically, a good chip seal will last 7 to 10 years.

There is a lot more traffic on our roads; more residents, water haulers and heavy equipment haulers. This puts more stress and wear on our road system. Believe it or not speeding adds a lot of wear to our roads!

Roads scheduled to be resurfaced include Marlin Blvd, Hukilau Lane, Sea Breeze Pkwy, sections of Reef Pkwy, Kona Dr and Mahi Mahi Dr. Our scheduled road work varies depending on current condition of the road. There is 6 miles left of the 2025 road schedule work on Aloha Blvd. & Princess Kaiulani Blvd. Please help us by traveling around the road work while in progress

BALLOT INSTRUCTIONS

It is important that you vote on the issues included herein. This is your opportunity to be counted and help decide the issues. To view a copy of the RMC Bylaws, go to our website www.hoveroad.com. The number in the corner of your mailing label on the newsletter represents the number of lots you own. If this label is incorrect in any way contact us. Do not alter your label. In the next section you have one vote per lot for each item on the Ballot. For Example, 6 (lots) x 1 = 6 entries. Place your total number of votes on either the YES or NO line. The completed ballot must be returned in the envelope provided. Be sure to place a first-class stamp on the envelope before mailing. Please allow at least TEN DAYS mailing time. On the back of your mailing envelope, there is a line for you to sign your name across the sealing flap for security reasons. To be counted, your mailed ballot must be received in our office prior to the meeting on Saturday, December 13, 2025. Our office will close at 4:00 pm HST. on Friday, December 12, 2025. Hand carried ballots or proxy ballots will be accepted at the meeting up until the last call for voting.

PLEASE HELP CLEAN UP OUR COMMUNITY OF ABANDONED VEHICLES!

It is a simple 2 step process. If you see an abandoned vehicle WITHOUT a Pink Tag, call 808-935-3311 (non-emergency police dispatch) to report the abandoned vehicle and provide cross streets, license plate, make and model. Once the vehicle has been tagged, after 5 days from the date on the tag, call 808-961-2226 and provide them with the tag #, date on tag, cross street, make/model and they will pick it up. If you have junk vehicles on your private property, there is a program to have up to 2 of those removed per fiscal year free of charge. PROPERTY SALES

When buying property in HOVE, be aware that HOVE Road Maintenance charges a Transfer Fee of either \$25.00 or \$35.00, depending on the circumstances. Many buyers acquired properties with existing liens and overdue balances. All outstanding debts are transferred to the new owner, including those properties bought at public auctions. To prevent unforeseen liabilities, it's advisable to perform extensive research or engage an escrow company.

When purchasing or selling property privately **YOU** will need to notify us and provide us with a copy of the recorded deed along with a \$35.00 transfer fee.
