### H.O.V.E. Rules of the Road.

#### Rules for All Vehicles.

- 1. All vehicles will operate in accordance with State, County and H.O.V.E. Rules and Regulations while utilizing the H.O.V.E. Road System.
- 2. Speed Limit on all H.O.V.E. roads is 25 MPH.
- 3. All vehicles will come to a full stop at all stop signs.
- 4. Report any damaged road signs.
- 5. Track Vehicles are **not** allowed on **any** H.O.V.E. road including the road setback.

# Categories for Commercial Trucks with or without trailers.

- 1. Trucks over 10 ton GVWR used on a regular basis to haul water, cinder or gravel, etc.
- 2. Trucks over 10 ton GVWR that are used less frequently for delivery purposes.
- 3. Trucks less than 10 ton GVWR.

## **Rules for Commercial Vehicles.**

- 1. Slow down and use lower gears on steep hills.
- 2. Any use of jake brakes must incorporate an approved legal muffler system.
- 3. Use of the H.O.V.E. roads is limited from **07:00** am to **5:00** pm only.
- 4. Commercial vehicles in Category 1 and 2 must enter and depart H.O.V.E. using either King Kamehameha Blvd. or Aloha Blvd. Truck Routes will be utilized to and from the nearest cross street adjacent to the delivery point.
- 5. Commercial Truckers must have all the proper Insurance, licenses and permits.

# Parking Regulations on H.O.V.E. Roads.

Parking on the paved surface of any H.O.V.E. road is not permitted. No part of any vehicle or the load shall protrude onto the pavement while parked.

Commercial Water Haulers are exempted for short periods of time to unload only if necessary. Any protrusion of the vehicle onto the pavement will be coned for safety.

Parking **any** vehicle within 100 feet of an intersection on any H.O.V.E. road, including the road setback, is not permitted.

Vehicle is defined as any motorized vehicle and includes any hitched or un-hitched trailers or other towable equipment.

Parking is defined as a vehicle that is stopped with the engine off and is occupied or not occupied.

Owners of vehicles violating these rules may be fined by RMC and/or the Hawaii Police Department.

Lot owners, with any authorized person on their property in violation of the Parking Regulations, may be included in the fine.

All H.O.V.E. lot owners are subject to the RMC Bylaws. Those who receive a fine and decline to pay may be subject to further legal action against their property.

First Offense: Written Warning. (These rules to be included).

Second Offense: \$50.00 Fine.

Third Offense: \$250.00 Fine. Any further violations may include restriction of H.O.V.E. road use.
