As the official before whom the deposition is being taken today, it's my responsibility to keep the record secure. I want to make all parties aware that AI notetaking and transcription apps raise privacy and security concerns, as they can access sensitive information and capture voice biometrics that could inadvertently be disseminated to unknown third parties. Your confidential discussions could be captured while off the record through these apps.

Wiretap statutes vary from state to state. For this reason, the consent of all participants should be obtained through other means, such as orally, before deploying these apps. Given these concerns, do all participants agree to waive the confidentiality and privacy that would typically be afforded to non-public proceedings at this time? If not, I'll request that counsel disable the app.
