### Malawi Village



The Malawi Village Scholarship fundraising line item is an intiative conceived by Bob and Linda (Cindy) Hunt to provide post secondary education to Malawi Village orphans unable to afford further education. Bob and Cindy's enterprise was based on a 2005 Malawi visit and interview of students.

The scholarships are awarded to applicants to cover tuition, room and board and books. The average grant is \$750 to \$1000. To date 58 students have completed their education. Other Rotary Clubs involved in this effort include Canandaigua,



Naples and Rochester with donations from the Last Man Standing Pool. Malawi Children's Village information is available on Google.





#### PROGRAM:

MaryBeth introduced Bill Poray, municipal historian for Perinton and the village of Fairport since 2013. He has had a lifetime interest in history, especially local history. A retiree of General Motors, Rochester Operations, Bill helped to secure and preserve the site's historic artifacts. As municipal historian, he researches local history, leads tours, provides presentations on numerous topics and meets with hundreds of school children each year on field trips and school assemblies. Bill is the 6th historian, and a Trustee of the Perinton Historical Society for many years. In 1825 the Erie Canal opened from Buffalo allowing commerce from the Atlantic Ocean to the Great Lakes and Midwest. The timeline can be viewed along the south side of the canal behind Moonlight Creamery. Showing photos and maps he shared that Heartswell Basin is called Bushnell's Basin today, that many swamps were drained into the canal. When the canal opened goods such as flour, whiskey and lumber were shipped. Each time the canal was widened new bridges had to be constructed. Bill answered a few questions and was presented with a Thank You coffee mug.


With \$211 in the big pot and \$9. in the small pot Newcomb held the lucky ticket, pulled the 7 of spades and donated her winnings back to the club.
