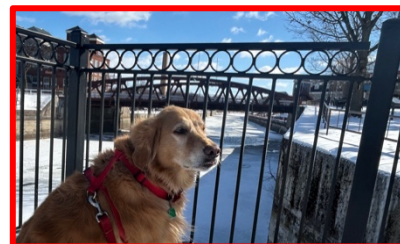

### Key Board Positions and Responsibilities

Role	Responsibilities
<b>President</b>	Presides at all club and board meetings, provides overall leadership and guidance, appoints committee chairs, ensures the club budget is managed, and works with the District Governor/ Assistant District Governor.
<b>Immediate Past President</b>	Serves as an advisor to the current president and the board, often acting as the chair of the advisory board to ensure continuity.
<b>President-Elect</b>	Prepares for their upcoming year as president, serves as a director on the board., and often concurrently serves as the Membership Committee Chair.
<b>Vice President</b>	Prepares for future club leadership roles and assists the president, potentially serving as an officer or standing committee chair. They have one vote on the board.
<b>Secretary</b>	Responsible for maintaining club records, tracking membership and attendance, taking minutes at board and club meetings, managing club correspondence, and ensuring club information on My Rotary is up to date.
<b>Treasurer</b>	Oversees all club finances, maintains accurate financial records, collects dues, pays bills, works with The Rotary Foundation on contributions and grants, presents monthly financial reports, and prepares an annual budget and financial review.
<b>Sergeant-at-Arms</b>	Helps maintain order and decorum during club meetings and events.
<b>Directors</b>	The board includes Directors, who are assigned responsibility for one or more from the Avenues of Service (Fellowship, Community Service, Public Relation, Club Services, Membership, Fundraising, The Rotary Foundation, New Generations) or other key club functions.

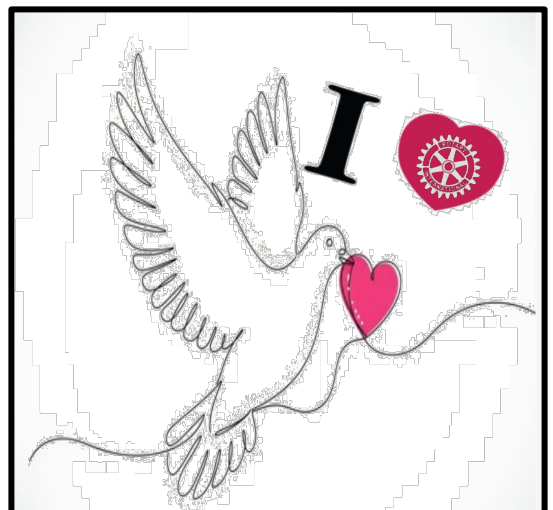

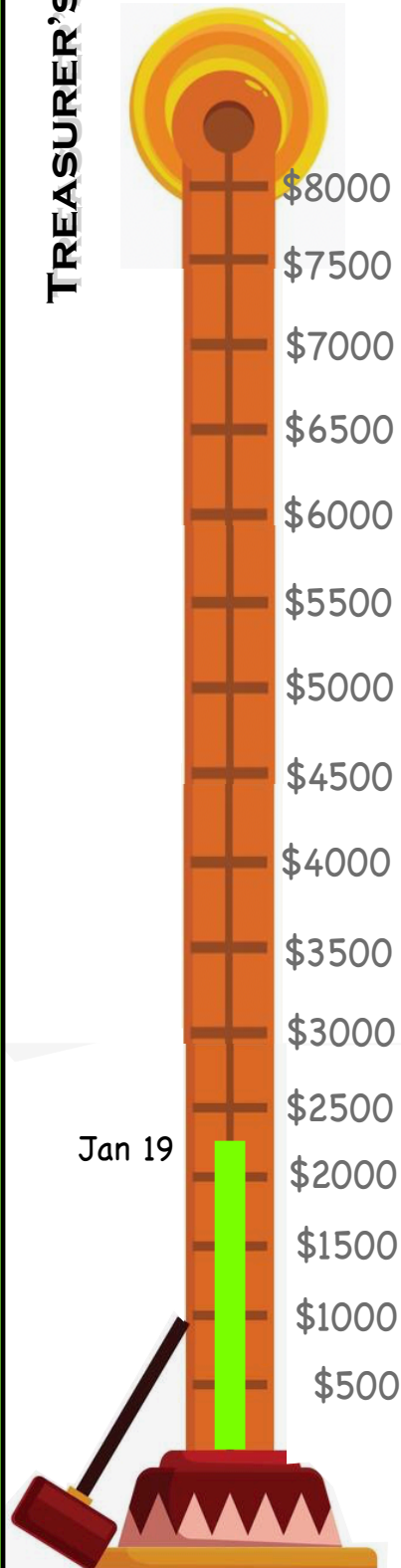

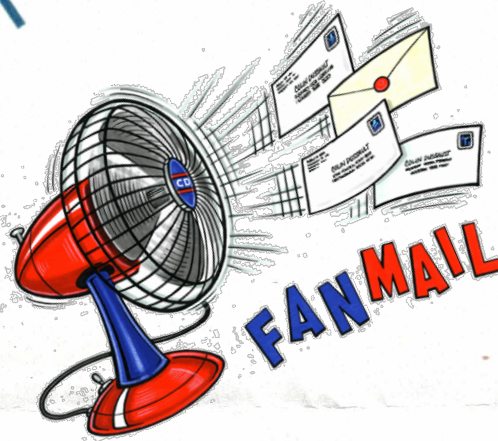

Dinner was served: Caesar salad, rolls, Chicken French adorned with sliced lemon over penne.

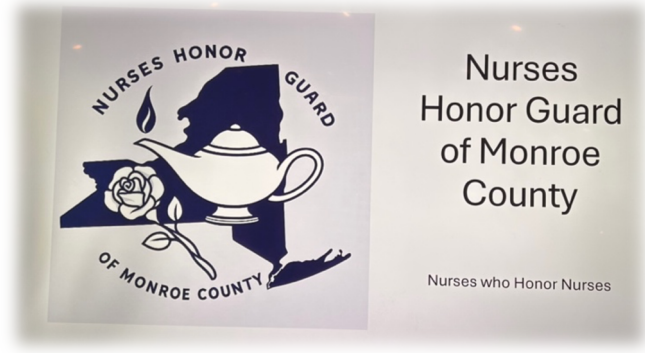
Pres. MaryBeth took the microphone and reminded us that Mark F is leading our Strategic Planning. A committee meeting was held following the Club's meeting.
