### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT





He was born in Argentina, moved to the US at 1 year old with his parents, grew up on Long Island, graduated from Geneseo. Ty is the property manager of WINN since 2010, then WINN Residential and currently Regional Vice President, working primarily on properties underdeveloped and have plans for redevelopment including The Pines and Sibley building in Rochester. He lives in Penfield with his wife and 3 sons.

Winn Companies parent company in Boston, is the 5<sup>th</sup> largest property managing company in the country focusing on development, residential and military housing. The Pines of Perinton has been managed by Winn since 2008 and purchased by Winn Companies in 2018-19 and is looking at redevelopment of the 508 apartments which range from Studio to 4 bedroom units. They offer affordable housing with different subsidized programs ranging from rents that are 30% of the resident's income and HUD subsidized to Mobile Vouchers which stay with the resident if they move. All utilities are paid through Winn Companies. Winn works with the Fairport Housing Authority. Currant residents' range in age from 18

to 62 years old representing many countries. There is a qualifying process, annual certification process done by a loyal hardworking staff.

Planning for renovations which will be done by DiMarco Constructors, the units that become vacant are not being filled so that construction can begin in 2022 and is expected to last 36-48 months. This time period may be inconvenient for the residents but they will not loose their housing and there is money in the budget to assist with this transition. With a Historic Tax Credit the building exterior will look similar with the white stucco. New flooring, kitchens with white cabinets and updated bathrooms are planned.

Winn Companies appreciates the partnerships with Generations, Learning Links and other amazing programs and social services which are offered to the residents.
