"GPEI Statement on Afghanistan August 19 The Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) is closely monitoring developments in Afghanistan. GPEI partners and staff are currently assessing immediate disruptions to polio eradication efforts and the delivery of other essential health services, to ensure continuity of surveillance and immunization activities while prioritizing the safety and security of staff and frontline health workers in the country. The polio program in Afghanistan has operated for many years amid insecurity and conflict, and will continue working with all actors, agencies and organizations who enable delivery of immunization as well as deliver humanitarian assistance to populations in need across the country. The GPEI remains steadfastly committed to protecting all children from polio and supporting the provision of other essential immunizations and health services. We strongly believe that the delivery of health care – including polio vaccination – is essential to prevent diseases and safeguard communities. Together with our partners, the people of Afghanistan, national and provincial authorities, we will do everything in our power to continue this critical work. LiftBridge for August 30, 2021

President John gaveled the meeting to order, Bob Linder led the pledge, and Marg Kerr offered the invocation before we tucked into our open-faced prime rib sandwiches and pommes frites.

Guests tonight included Warren Knapp's wife, Pat, immediate past district governor Linda Kohl, and district secretary and Victor Rotarian Karen Parkhurst.

Linda Kohl called immediate past president Mark Fuerbacher to the podium to receive a District Rotary Citation, which the club earned for 2020-21 by meeting all the necessary criteria. Moments later, President John gave Mark and Becky Wilson their past president pins.

President John offered congratulations to Nicole Simonetti, who won the Women's Club Championship at Midvale over the weekend. Nicole will lead a women's foursome for our club in the Rotary District tournament on Sept. 10.

Brandon Scribner reminded everyone that Monday, Sept. 20, is our annual road cleanup project on Ayrault Road. Details to come.



Heinrich. Fischer announced that tickets soon would be

available to sell for our annual Pasta Dinner at the VFW, which again will be a pre-sale, takeoutonly affair. Each Rotarian will get 10 tickets to sell -- and will be financially responsible for half of them.

Pieter Smeenk offered tonight's "Membership Minute," noting that the number of Rotarians in the world remains at 1.2 million, no change in some seven years -- despite lots of departures and additions. He encourages members to practice the "each one bring one" campaign and invite someone you know to meeting.



Ron Roberts then introduced guest speaker Chris Veronda, who worked with Ron and Scott Winner of the Fairport-Perinton Partnership to help develop the highly successful Train Watching Platform in the Village, which was adapted from the Albert H. Knapp Rotary pavilion funded some years ago by our club. Chris explained why Fairport is such an ideal spot for rail fans -- and others -- to enjoy the spectacle of trains rushing by. His simplest explanation? "We have trains!" Some 40 trains a day go through Fairport, including 8 Amtrak passenger trains, and many of the freight trains are much longer than in the past with a second engine somewhere in the middle.

The platform is extremely popular with local residents, he said, not just diehard rail fans. A group of young moms meet there regularly with their children, and a group of Mennonites come to town to watch the trains.


Chris noted that CSX, which runs this section of rail, is one of five major railroads and has some 21,000 miles of track. It is also hugely profitable, a Wall Street darling worth some \$75 billion.

He said that Fairport has a long and rich rail history, dating back 170 years, 100 of which were under the New York Central auspices. His tip for train watchers: 11 am to 1 pm, and 5 pm to 7 pm are the hours that have the most trains passing by.

The 50-50 pot of \$13 was won by Heinrich Fischer, who donated it to Rotary Foundation. The larger pot now has \$45.
