Rotarians from across Upstate New York gathered to hear Rotary International President Elect Jenifer Jones, talk about the future of Rotary and Rotary's Polio Eradication efforts. As I have mentioned, the world has gone 9 months since the last case of polio has been reported. This year, only two cases have been reported, one in Afghanistan and one in Pakistan. Those cases occurred in January. When the last cases of polio are reported, there is a three-year observation period before the world is declared polio-free. Drew Kessler, our incoming Zone Director, joined Jennifer for a Q&A session. Great evening.







President John called the meeting to order. Hunter Fuerbacher led the Pledge and Tom Wolanski gave the Invocation.


The first new-member Induction of this Rotary Year featured Scott Baker – sponsored by Dave Scheirer. Welcome Scott!
