Letter to All Saints

In his book "Hope Against Darkness," Richard Rohr guides believers through dark times. In Chapter 4, he writes what most of us know from experience, that change brings stress, whether it's planned or unexpected. We encounter this often in our families, community, and nation. He encourages us to adopt "an attitude of listening and trusting and waiting. It is the only way to 'get out of the way' with our judgments, control mechanisms and personal opinions." This attitude helps everyone involved. Focusing on God helped me to trust and heal after my mother died. This practice is helpful to caregivers, too. It keeps us from taking the burden of suffering on ourselves. When we open ourselves to allow God to work through us, we are more useful to God.*

Thank you for coming together to celebrate the parish at the Annual Meeting. Since August, I've witnessed your gifts. You express your love of God and this church in so many ways.

Ongoing vestry member Cheryl Hooper will be assisted by new vestry member Iris Darling as co-senior wardens. Cheryl and Iris are long-time collaborators in education and church leadership, and they bring excellent communication and analytical skills, and a deep devotion to the Episcopal Church to their shared role.
