COTS Walk – Sunday, May 5, 2024

All Saints Church will host a team in the 35th annual COTS walk on Sunday, May 5, 2024.

COTS, formerly known as the Committee on Temporary Shelter, is a local organization dedicated to helping people meet their acute needs when they are without a home and to helping them take steps to get permanent housing.

This will be the third year that All Saints has had a team participating in the walk. All are welcome to join the team, either as walkers on May 5 or as virtual walkers. Both kinds of walkers need to raise money by asking people for contributions before the walk. Members of our parish who are not walkers will have abundant opportunities to support the team during the month of April.

Registration for the walk is now open. Visit the website, <u>cotsonline.org</u> where you will find clear instructions on how to register, including, new this year, a short video that will guide you through the registration process. Be sure to register as a member of the All Saints Church team.

Soon I will have envelopes available for you to collect and record your donations. Donations can also be made online, where they can be credited to you and to our All Saints team. Our church has been gifted money from Hilla Damm, Don Crofut and Janet Bessmer. Our kitchen was gifted by George Singer and dedicated to his wife Gloria. It was not a working kitchen prior to the gift of money and skill. There is a plaque above the kitchen memorializing this gift. And then we all gift daily, weekly or monthly to this church to keep the doors open. Each gift says we believe in this future.

Our church could not exist without the leadership of our Deacon Peggy, our administrator Margaret MacLean, our Senior Warden Ed Darling, and Art Hessler, the Vestry, and then all of our lay people who have been trained to give reflections: Marian Halloran, Yolande Franklin, Sheila Stanton, Julie Bonanno, Cheryl Hooper and Iris Darling. The altar guild people who set up the altar for worship: Pam Roberts, Debra Lunn, Marga Sproul, Sheila Stanton and Peggy Mathauer. Our Ushers and Greeters, our Technicians, the various committee members. They are our pillars and without their time and devotion we would not have a future. The doors are open beyond 10 to noon: the hour of worship and then the hour to enjoy food, drink and companionship. This would not happen without the selfless people behind the scenes like Ellie, Margaret, Pam, Becky, Chris and Erinn.

Celebrating the Risen Christ

Ilia Delio invites us to find creative ways to "go to church' and celebrate new life and resurrection.

Where is this risen Christ? Everywhere and all around us---in you, your neighbor, the dogwood tree outside, the budding grape vine, the ants popping up through the cracks. The whole world is filled with God, who is shining through even the darkest places of our lives. To "go to church" is to awaken to this divine presence in our midst and respond in love with a yes: Your life, O God, is my life and the life of the planet.....

We have an invitation to go to church in a new way, by praying before the new leaves budding through dormant trees or the wobbly flowers by the side of the road pushing through the solid earth....[Like Francis of Assisi,] we too can sing with the air we breathe, the sun that shines upon us, the rain that pours down to water the earth. And we can cry with those who are mourning with the forgotten, with those who are suffering from disease or illness, with the weak, with the imprisoned. We can mourn in the solidarity of compassion, but we must live in the hope of new life. For we are Easer people, and we are called to celebrate the whole earth as the body of Christ. Every act done in love gives glory to God: a pause of thanksgiving, a laugh, a gaze at the sun, or just raising a toast to your friends at your virtual gathering. The good news? "He is not here!" Christ is everywhere, and love will make us whole.

Book Reading and Discussion

The St Paul's, St Thomas, All Saints – and beyond – book discussion group, focuses on racial justice, and is led by Lenore Morse, of St Paul's. For April, they read and discussed "The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We Can Prosper Together," by Heather McGhee.
