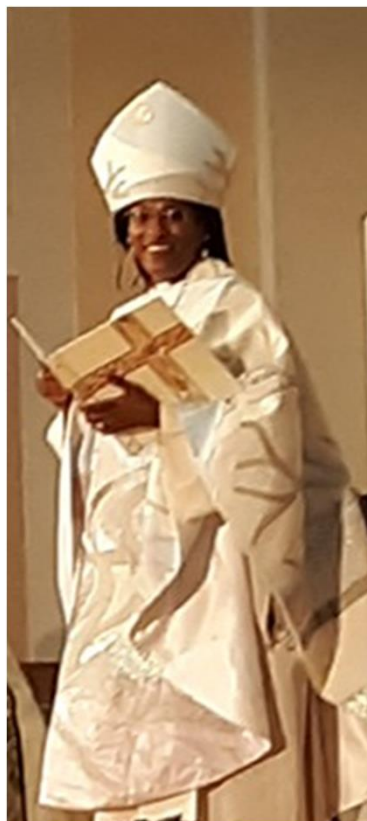

The Episcopal Church was on display in all of its ecclesiastical splendor including: The Presiding Bishop Michael Curry! Choirs and musicians! Gospel Hymns! Bishops! Priests and Deacons! Laypersons from every congregation! Vergers and Banners in procession! Family and Friends or our new bishop from all parts of the country!

The Reverend Dr. Jill Rierdan will be the Celebrant & Preacher on October 13th while David is away. She is recently moved to Shelburne and the Diocese of Vermont, having previously lived in one of the small hilltowns of Western Massachusetts while serving in the Diocese of Western Mass. In addition to being ordained as a priest, she is trained as a Spiritual Director and Labyrinth facilitator. Before attending seminary and being ordained, she was a clinical psychologist and professor in university and clinical settings in the Boston and San Francisco areas. Throughout the years as psychologist and priest she has been a craftswoman, specializing in paper arts, making jewelry, wall hangings, and baskets out of paper.

Safer Church Basic Training

The Episcopal Church in Vermont will offer a Safer Church Basic Training on **Saturday, October 19th, at St. John's in the Mountains Stowe**, from **8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.** Topics include power, authority, and boundaries in ministerial relationships, and prevention, identification, and response to elder, child, and youth abuse among other topics.

Persons who are paid or volunteer with children or youth or any vulnerable population, Eucharistic Visitors, and employees of a congregation are required to take this training. All other leaders and members of our congregation are encouraged to attend.

More information can be found on the Diocesan website at diovermont.org including dates of all trainings and registration. The basic training must be refreshed every 5 years by completing recertification. If you have any questions, please see Peggy Mathauer.
