And what greater joy do we have other than the Resurrection of Christ? This is because each Divine Liturgy is a celebration of the Resurrection. All of the parishes in the Metropolitan Church of Pittsburgh have been following this directive of the Bishops which was promulgated in 2006. This is a restoration of true Eastern Tradition. If it is not physically possible for you to stand, please feel free to kneel or sit. You may begin standing during the Divine Liturgies now if you wish to.
