# Renewing for 2025 -new exciting updates

Renewing your site has never been easier! We are now offering online renewal. You can review and sign our policies, make a payment, or see scheduled payments online through the guest portal. However, you will need to **come in and sign the 2025 form**. Please reach out to let us know how you would like to pay for your 2025 season and the rest is as easy as sunbathing!

Remember that cedar cove offers 3 easy ways to pay:

- 1) Pay in full. You can pay in full and sign your paperwork. You can pay by cash, cheque, E-transfer, credit card, bank transfer, or debit. Please note that credit card payments will be charged 1.4%.
- 2) Pay Monthly. You can pay monthly by bank transfer through the online guest portal. You must have your banking information entered through the guest portal. Your site fees and dock slip will be 2 separate payments.
- 3) Pay in 3 payments. These payments must be done by bank transfer, and also require you to enter your banking information through the guest portal. The payments will be scheduled for October 1<sup>st</sup>, January 1<sup>st</sup>, and April 30<sup>th</sup>. Your dock slips and site fees will be 2 separate payments

For the 2025 season, we will require both principal Occupants to sign the license of occupation once more. Please pop into the office and get Avery or Sarah to help you out! In future years, you can simply renew this contract year after year through the guest portal.

Any changes to occupants (principal occupants, or eligible family members) must be done through Eric. Please make an appointment if you wish to make any changes.

Once you have indicated what payment schedule you will be using, and added your banking info online, we will schedule your payments and make the appropriate documents available for acknowledgement and signature.

That's it! Once you have paid, or arranged for your payment schedule and you have signed your paperwork online you are renewed!

## Walking paths

As you may know by now, we have extended the walking path to loop around Peters Pond. If you have not yet checked it out make sure to go and see it! We want to remind parents to tell their little ones not to venture past the limits of the walking trails. There have been some young campers hanging out beyond the walking trail towards Skipper's Island. As much as we want to encourage adventure, we want to remind you all that this area is unsupervised and could be very dangerous. Dogs must be on a leash on paths as well.
