This online round table conference had six young panelists, all still in their twenties, who dream of advancing the spirituo-scientific domain in their own unique ways.

Ms. Ananya Agrawal: She is a psychologist with a year of experience as a mental health educator. Currently, she is pursuing her M.Phil. in Clinical Psychology. She is deeply fascinated by human behavior, emotions, and the intricate ways in which people interact with the world. Her passion lies in understanding the complexities of the human mind and using this knowledge to help others. She is committed to continually learning and evolving, both as a psychologist and as an individual, striving to make a meaningful impact in the field of mental health.

Ms. Anmol Rai: She holds a master's degree in Public Health from IIHMR Delhi and is currently working as a Research Assistant at the Asian Development Research Institute. She chose to pursue public health because she is passionate about improving health outcomes and addressing health disparities in communities. She believes that understanding the social determinants of health is crucial for effective interventions. She is excited to explore spirituality and its intersection with health and well-being.

Ms. Anoushka Tripathi: Passionate about VLSI, she sees herself as the architect of technology's invisible backbone, ensuring a strong foundation for progress. He presented his ideas in the Science of Consciousness Online Conference 2020 organized by the Centre for Consciousness Studies, University of Arizona. 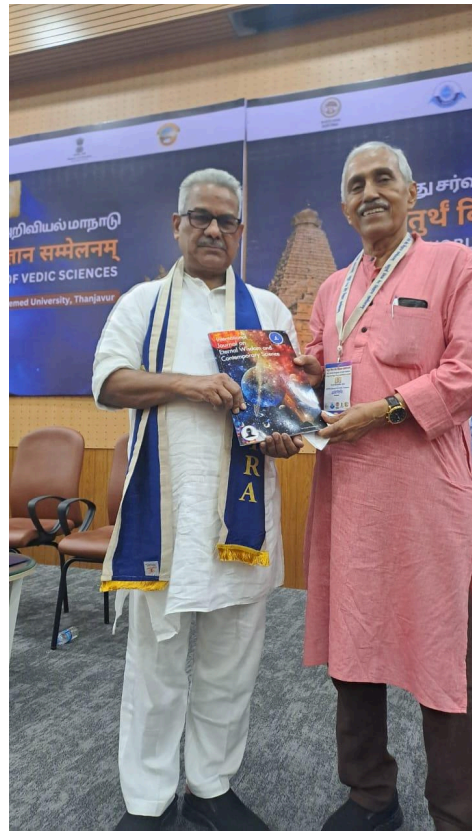
Guest of Honor:

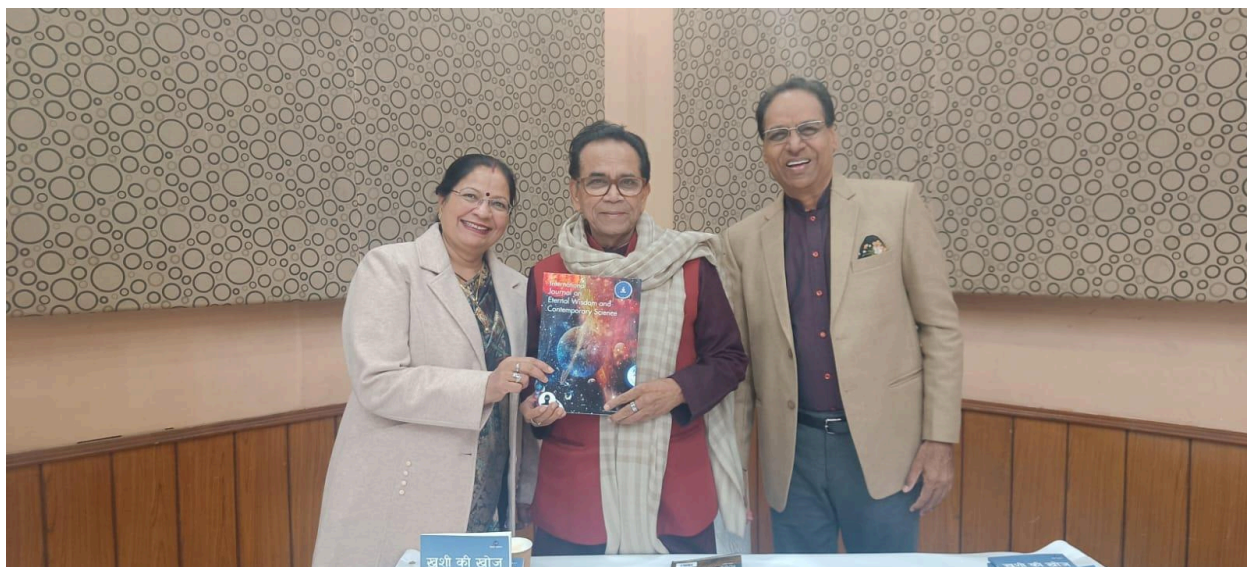

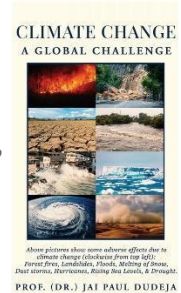
