

Tincture or Syringe

What's the Difference?

Tincture

A tincture is a liquid extract of cannabis made by steeping the plant in alcohol or another solvent. It often comes in a dropper bottle for easy dispensing.

Tinctures are usually taken sublingually - under the tongue - for quick absorption or added to food and beverages.

Tinctures can vary in potency, but they generally contain a lower concentration of THC compared to oils in syringes.



Syringe

A cannabis syringe usually contains a concentrated oil or extract in a precise, plunger-style container, allowing for exact measurements.

Syringes are often used to dispense oil directly, either for mixing into food, topping off bowls, or direct consumption.

Syringes typically contain highly concentrated cannabis oils, providing a more potent dose in smaller quantities.

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
