**USEFUL TIDBITS OF INFORMATION**



1. As the weather gets colder it is time to begin winterizing your property. Don't forget about those critters that will be spending their winter out in the cold. Make sure there is a water source that won't freeze - heated water bowls are a life saver and not too expensive if purchased online. **Dogs and cats absolutely need shelter and somewhere warm to go when the temperatures dip below freezing.**
2. Be careful when starting a vehicle on a cold morning - community cats and other small creatures often seek warmth under the hood, or in a wheel well. It's a good idea to knock on the hood a few times before getting into the vehicle to alert any temporary guests and give them time to escape. Falling from under the hood of a moving vehicle or being trapped under the hood can cause terrible injuries to little animals, if they survive at all!

Pet food distribution is an important aspect of what ARGONN does to help the community of Fernley, and the Highway 50 corridor from Silver Springs to Dayton. In Fernley we support the Fernley Food Pantry and the Fernley Senior Center by delivering as much donated dog and cat food as possible for distribution to the folk that need it.

Along the Highway 50 corridor one of our members, Nancy McPherson, 'sets up shop' once a month, on different days, at the Silver Stage Food Pantry and the Dayton Food Pantry.
