The American Kennel Club will collect the following at every Licensed or Member club event: • First entry of a dog in Conformation or Obedience, a \$3.00 Event Service Fee and \$.50 Recording Fee, plus a \$3.50 Service Fee for each additional entry of the same dog.

- First entry and each additional entry of a dog in Agility or Rally, a \$3.50 Service Fee.
- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned
 entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of
 Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and/or Baray Events
 assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the
 owner's agent. RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETENESS OF ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH ENTRANT.
- RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE. BaRay Events will add a \$30.00 collection fee
 to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. The exhibitor will be contacted & required
 to send a money order for the original amount PLUS the \$30.00 NSF fee. Subsequent returned checks from same
 person may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY BASIS.
- REFUNDS for cancellations due to judge change or cancellations made prior to entries closing will be mailed by
 the Club to said Exhibitor or Agent AFTER THE SHOW. An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from all
 refunds for entries cancelled prior to the closing of entries.
- Females in season are not permitted to compete in Obedience or Rally Trials. If a female is withdrawn from competition because it came into season and the Superintendent is notified no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class in the trial, the Clubs is required to refund the entry fee. The Clubs may retain a processing fee and must publish this information in the premium. Clubs may determine the documentation, if any that is required to confirm the female is in season. This shall be stated in the premium. Note: No fee is paid to the AKC for females in season who are withdrawn.
- · FAX ENTRIES Fax entries will not be accepted.
- Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the
 Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been
 entered incorrectly. There is no refund for DUPLICATE ENTRIES or OVERPAYMENTS. If, because of riots, civil
 disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the
 Show NO REFUND will be made. To find out about any AKC event cancellations call the AKC Event Cancellation
 Hotline 877-252-3229.
- Please note: Any hotel or motel listed in the premium list is subject to Event Committee Rules. We expect our
 exhibitors to be responsible guests. A report that an exhibitor at this show has abused hotel or motel property
 during this weekend may result in disciplinary action. Clubs reserve the right to decline future entries from the
 offending party in accordance with the provisions of Ch. 11, Sec. 15 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.
- Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs must
 be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service
 for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a
 class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- LOSS OR DAMAGE The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external
 parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Additionally, clubs should include any
 specific local health requirements; for example proof of rabies vaccination.

The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed or Variety competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record, or Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The entry and showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90- days from the day of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owners' records.

Select Dog, Select Bitch, and then Awards of Merit (where applicable,) Best Hunting Retriever will be chosen immediately following Best of Breed competition. This will be followed by Best Owner-Handled and competition for Best from the Regular Puppy Classes, Best from the Bred By Exhibitor Classes, and Best from the Veteran Classes. (See Special Recognition, page 13)

Reserve Winners Dog and Reserve Winners Bitch will be awarded a three-point major, provided the criteria set forth in Chapter 16. Section 1 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows are met.

HUNTING RETRIEVER STARTED CLASS (divided by sex) – For any dog/bitch that has a FCRSA Working Certificate (WC) or an AKC Retriever Test Junior Hunter (JH) title, or Junior Hunter Upland.

HUNTING RETRIEVER INTERMEDIATE CLASS (divided by sex) – For any dog/bitch that has a FCRSA Working Certificate Excellent (WCX), an AKC Retriever Test Senior Hunter (SH) title, Field Trial Derby placement or JAM, or Senior Hunter Upland.

HUNTING RETRIEVER FINISHED CLASS (divided by sex) – For any dog/bitch that has an AKC Retriever Test Master Hunter (MH) title or a Qualifying or All-Age Field Trial placement or JAM. AKC Spaniel Test Titles do not qualify..

Dogs must be eligible to compete in AKC conformation (intact and have full registration). Qualifying titles for Hunting Retriever classes must be completed by closing of conformation entries - March 13. 2024.

The winners of the Veteran and Hunting Retriever Classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed, provided that they are undefeated in any Regular Class at this show.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES, INVOLVING MULTIPLE ENTRIES - JUDGE: MARIA WHITE

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dogs and two of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. The Stud Dog may be entered separately in one of the Regular or Non-Regular Classes or if a Champion of Record, for Best of Breed/Variety Competition or may be entered for Stud Dog Class only at the regular entry fee. The Get MUST be entered in one of the Regular Classes and should be indicated as "GET" in the additional class box on the entry form. The Stud Dog unit shall be considered as one entry and requires only one entry fee. The Stud Dog must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and shown in the ring with his Get. Entry judged only on the merits of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard for the Breed.

BROOD BITCH CLASS - Same as Stud Dog, except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog, and Brood Bitch will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged First in these classes will be eligible to complete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

4-6 MONTH BEGINNER PUPPY COMPETITION - JUDGE: KELLY L. HOLLAND

One combined class will be offered for dogs that are (4) four months & under (6) six months. There will be a selection of Best of Breed 4 & Under 6 Months puppy, and Best of Opposite Sex.

An AKC registration number or AKC litter number will be required for all entries.

A foreign born dog may enter this class if they are registered in the country of origin.

Dogs are required to be vaccinated (including rabies) in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol in order to avoid inadvertent transmission of illness by/to puppies not yet fully immunized.

Dogs that are owned or co-owned by a professional handler may compete in this class, but must be handled by a non-professional handler. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs to or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants or household members of a professional handler. A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis or assisting a professional handler at the show or any show during the cluster/weekend.

AKC Rules in Dealing with Misconduct will be applicable to any person and dog entered at this competition. All applicable rules found in Rules Applying to Dog Shows will govern the conduct of this competition unless these regulations state otherwise. Exhibitors should plan on opening the mouth of their puppy for the judges. Dogs with breed standard disqualifications should not be excused but may not receive placements.

The Sweepstakes is open to all Flat-Coated Retrievers that are 6 months and under 18 months on the day of the show. All entries in the Puppy Sweepstakes must be entered in a regular class, at the regular entry fee, and on the regular entry form. Indicate Sweepstakes class with the age division in the space provided on the entry form for "Additional Classes". Champions of record are allowed. Foreign dogs/bitches may be entered in Sweepstakes. Entry fee is \$35.00.

The Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Flat-Coated Retrievers that are 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in any other class. Champions of Record are allowed. Neutered dogs and spayed bitches may be entered in Veteran Sweepstakes. Qualifying scores are not required for awards in non-regular classes. "Dog" means either sex.

OBEDIENCE CLASS TRANSFERS ("Move-ups") are allowed if space is available.

VETERANS: is for dogs that have an obedience title and are at least 7 years old on the date of the Trial. The exercises will be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. Dogs may be entered in another class or classes.

VERSATILITY: Optional titling class. Open to all dogs that are eligible under AKC's Obedience Regulations (amended 12/15). Owners may enter more than one dog. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person, and may be entered in another class or classes at the same trial. No group exercises.

TEAM: You must specify which four dogs go with which team, since owners are not required in the rules to be identical. Five dogs may be entered, one to be considered an alternate for which no entry fee will be required. Dogs need not be entered in another class. However, the same four dogs will perform all exercises. If possible, submit Team Obedience entries together. The dogs on a team will perform the exercises simultaneously and be judged as in the Novice class, except a Drop on Recall will replace a Recall. Handlers and dogs may wear costuming that is in good taste.

BRACE: The Brace class will be for two dogs of similar height that are capable of performing the Novice exercises. The dogs need not be owned by the same person but will be handled by one handler. Dogs may be shown unattached or coupled (the coupling device will not be less than 6 inches). Whichever method is used will be continued throughout all exercises. The Brace should work in unison at all times. Exercises, performances, and judging will be as in the Novice class.

RALLY

Eligible dogs will be identified by an asterisk in the judge's book, steward's book & the catalog. Dogs must be handled by an eligible owner/handler for the AKC NOHS throughout the breed level (all classes, Winners, and Best of Breed) competition. Additionally, dogs must be handled by an eligible owner/handlerfor all AKC National Owner Handled Series competition (Group and Best in Show). Any person may exhibit the dog in the regular Group and Best in Show competitions.

Owner-Handled Best of Breed will be selected from the dogs that are eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition including Winners Dog, Winners Bitch and winners of the non-regular classes. No class dogs other than the Winners Dog & Winners Bitch are eligible to return to the ring.

*Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years.

**A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis, or assisting a professional handler at the show or any time during the cluster/weekend. Current assistants that are eligible to compete in Junior Showmanship (meet age & amateur status requirements may participate in NOHS.

- Field qualify, place, or JAM in a hunt test stake, WC/WCX test, steady or unsteady singles stake.
- Agility qualify in any standard, jumpers, time to beat or FAST class.
- · Obedience qualify or place in any regular or non-regular class, including Team or Brace.
- Rally qualify or place in any regular or non-regular class, including Team.
- Fast Cat Q or Dock Diving Q (one or the other)

To be eligible for the Citrus Bowl Award, you must return the sign-up form provided at the National or fill out the form on the website by April 11, 2024.

(The Committee decided on a Q (no title). A dock diving title requires 5 qualifying jumps, and none of the other Tri-awards require multiple Q's. Per the regs: "A qualifying jump is when the dog enters the water from the dock, regardless of the toy being thrown." A title in Novice is 5 qualifying jumps between 1 foot and 9ft 11in. So, although it sounds easy to get a Q, isn't that the purpose, to get people to try it)

STUD DOG SHOWCASE

The FCRSA is pleased to announce the first Stud Dog Showcase to be held as part of the national specialty in Ocala FL. The Stud Dog Showcase is an opportunity for owners of stud dogs to let their lovely boys be seen, up close, by many flat-coat owners at one time. This opportunity is not limited to dogs in the top 20 in conformation; dogs that primarily compete in the field or other venues are also encouraged to showcase their stud dog.

A dedicated vendor space will be set up for the owners to bring their stud dog(s) at a designated time so that those interested in a particular stud can see them up close, put their hand on the dog, and ask questions of the owner. The Stud Dog Showcase will be Tuesday through Thursday and depending on the number of individuals that sign up the amount of time for each owner will be approximately 30 minutes; a schedule will be made available. Owners may sign up 1-3 dogs for a time slot; however, all dogs in a specified time slot must be owned by the same person. The cost is \$50 for the first dog and \$25 each for the second and third dog.

The following guidelines should be considered:

- All dogs in the showcase must be 2 years of age and have all breed appropriate health testing with passing results.
- A 30 minute time slot will be offered to each owner; if bringing 3 dogs owner may be offered a longer time slot depending on time available
- 3. Owners are encouraged to have a packet or poster (or both!) that includes:
 - · Registered Name (with titles!)
 - Date of birth
 - Copy of Pedigree
 - OFA clearances, any genetic testing (Color, DM, etc.)
 - · Pictures of dog stacked, moving, and a head-shot.
 - Description of the temperament
 - Semen availability frozen, fresh chilled, or live cover
 - Copy of stud contract
 - Owner contact information (phone, email, home address)
 - Other helpful information would include the grooming spot number where the dog is crated (and owner/handler info), the class the dog is entered in and armband number, and if they have any offspring at the show and in which class they are entered.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
