


Thank you for your time, dedication, and commitment to GSNENY. Every Girl Scout volunteer is truly extraordinary and deserves our heartfelt appreciation! Each year, there are many who shine brighter, going above and beyond to make an exceptional impact. These recognitions listed in this handbook are crafted to honor these exceptional individuals.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Any adult over the age of 18 involved at any level of volunteering. This includes but is not limited to leaders, parent helpers, service unit team members and council volunteers.
- Must be a current registered Girl Scout adult in good standing with GSNENY (ie: completed all required training, current background check, no outstanding balances or restrictions)
- Actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behaviors.
- Provides service that is above and beyond expectations for the position held.

Must follow GSUSA and GSNENY policies and guidelines. As recognition recipients, they are being held up as a role model who shows progression as a leader in their role. Must have performed services between October 1 and September 30 of the current or previous membership year unless otherwise stated in criteria of a specific recognition.

IMPORTANT DATES

Nominations Start: **December 2, 2025**
Nomination Deadline: **March 23, 2026 at 9am**

All nominations must be submitted electronically using the Jotform.
Paper nominations will not be accepted.

Late nominations will not be considered for recognition in 2026.

WHO CAN NOMINATE?

Nominations can be submitted by anyone OTHER than the nominee. This includes but is not limited to GSNENY council staff, GSNENY volunteers, Girl Scout family members, and Girl Scouts. The person submitting the nomination does not need to be a registered member of Girl Scouts. Before you nominate a volunteer, refer to the list of recognitions in this handbook to review the descriptions and requirements. Then, complete and submit the online Jotform nomination form. All nominations must be submitted electronically, paper submissions will not be accepted. Late submissions will not be considered for recognition in 2026.

Pro Tip: it's not all on you! Recruit other to complete and submit nomination forms!

Some awards require multiple endorsement letters. When needed, multiple Jotform submissions for a nominee to receive an award will be required from different nominators. Endorsement letters should speak specifically to the criteria for the recognition the volunteer is being nominated for using specific examples and measurable outcomes.

HOW TO NOMINATE?

- 1 Choose the recognition that best matches the outstanding contributions of the nominee
- 2 Recruit others to complete and submit the required number of nomination forms for the award for the nominee.
- 3 Complete the JotForm nomination submission for the nominee. You will receive an email confirmation after each submission.

While you can nominate multiple people for awards, each nominee requires their own nomination form to be completed separately. Each endorsement letter requires a separate JotForm submission.

HOW THE NOMINATION PROCESS WORKS

All nominations are reviewed, and awards status is determined by the GSNENY Volunteer Services Department and/or select committee members, unless otherwise noted. This group of individuals prioritizes service impact, meaning more weight is given to results rather than years in a position (although it often takes some time in a position before the person can achieve truly outstanding results).

The group review each nomination and endorsement and compare the information presented about the volunteer with the criteria established for each recognition. Upon review, they will:

- Approve the candidate for a nominated recognition OR,
- Approve the candidate for a different recognition OR,
- Deny the nomination. In a case where there is no indication given that the candidate's service met the criteria, the nomination could be denied.

Approved nominees for Council-level and GSUSA-level recognitions will be awarded at the GSNENY annual Volunteer Appreciation Dinner in April 2026. Each approved nominee will be notified via email that they have been approved for an award but will not find out which award until it is presented. For the award recipients unable to attend the Volunteer Appreciation dinner, all recognitions will be provided to their Service Unit Managers, or available for pickup at one of our Service Centers after the Volunteer Appreciation Dinners have concluded.

RECEIVING YOUR AWARD

Approved nominees for Council-level and GSUSA-level recognitions will be awarded at the GSNENY annual Volunteer Appreciation Dinners in April 2026. Each approved nominee will be notified via email that they have been approved for an award but will not find out which award until it is presented. For the award recipients unable to attend the Volunteer Appreciation dinner, all recognitions will be provided to their Service Unit Managers, or available for pickup at one of our Service Centers after the Volunteer Appreciation Dinners have concluded.

HOW TO WRITE A STRONG NOMINATION

The Volunteer Recognitions rely heavily on the content received. Use this chart to convert a statement into the strongest nomination for review.

Initial Statement

“She has been a leader for a long time.”

Thoughtfully Consider

How many years?
Through which levels?

Strong Nomination Statement

“For 11 years, she has led a large troop from Daisies, persevering through the challenging middle school years, to their current Senior Troop.”

“Our Leader is Great!”

What kind of leadership qualities do they bring? What makes them stand out?

“Our leader continually brings leadership opportunities to the girls. They support a girl-led approach by encouraging girls to vote on and implement their activites.”

“Our Leader always goes above and beyond”

Be specific! Tell a story about the great benefits received by those around them due to their efforts.

“Her troop voted to start the aMuse Journey. Because she never considered herself a “creative soul” when it came to artistic endeavors, she recruited troop parents, artists, and actors as resources for her girls to draw from. As a result, the girls had a great time meeting community experts and discovering parent talent in their own troop! They now have several opportunities for Take Action projects.”

PRESIDENTIAL VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARDS



In 2023, the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation founded the President's Volunteer Service Award to recognize the important role of volunteers in America's strength and national identity. This award honors individuals whose service positively impacts communities in every corner of the nation and inspires those around them to take action, too.

THE PRESIDENT'S VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARD IS ON A TEMPORARY PAUSE,
AS DECIDED BY AMERICORPS EFFECTIVE MAY 27, 2025.

Purpose: Recognizes volunteer for their hours of service to a volunteer organization which can include GSNENY.

Eligibility: Any Girl Scout Adult Member who is an approved Volunteer.

These awards are earned based on self-reported hours. Hours must be tracked annually and submitted with award application. All hours must be completed within a 12-month period unless otherwise stated.

The nominee has taken a leadership role at the council level in one or more of the following areas:

- Increasing membership growth and retention
- Increasing the percentage of adult-generated funding in the total council income
- Increasing innovative program or training opportunities and participation council-wide

- Consistently lives by and practices the ideals outlined in the Girl Scout Promise & Law
- Completed all appropriate leader trainings
- Assistance to GSNENY or GSUSA measurably contributing to the goals and/or objectives of the region

The nominee actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior.

3 letters of Endorsement

- Girl Scout Volunteer who provided significant assistance during product program seasons in their first or second year as a volunteer.
- Consistently lives by and practices the ideals outlined in the Girl Scout Promise & Law
- Completed all appropriate leader trainings

Honors a leader, in good standing, who is nominated by the Girls/parents of their troop for the exceptional Girl Scout Experience that the leader delivers.



Pre-Requisites/Nominations/Endorsements

1 Nomination

1 letter of Endorsement

Provided from any parent or girl associated with the troop.

A volunteer may receive this recognition more than once.

Criteria:

- A leader in good standing who has delivered exceptional Girl Scout Experience to their troop/Service Unit.
- Consistently lives by and practices the ideals outlined in the Girl Scout Promise & Law
- Completed all appropriate leader trainings
- The nominee actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior.

These are awards that are Council-nominated. These cannot be nominated for by volunteers but we place them here to make you aware of them.

Minimum Criteria for all Council Nominated Awards:

- Must have a current Girl Scout membership.
- Must not owe any debt to council.
- Consistently lives by and practices the ideals outlined in the Girl Scout Promise & Law.
- The nominee actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior.



Helping Hands

Recognizes adult volunteers who give of their time to assist with council-run events, programming, council committees, and product sales.

Volunteers may receive this recognition more than once.

Legacy Award

Recognizes a volunteer with 10 or more consecutive years with the same service unit. This award is automatically given when Council is notified that a member has served ten years in their service unit.

Awarded in 10-year increments



Service to Adults

This award is given to the Service Unit that has an adult retention rate of 75% or more.

Award can be earned more than once



Product Program Rockstar Awards

This award is given to the Service Unit Sweets and Treats Manager for their dedication to the Sweets and Treats Product Program. Managers that increase their overall Sweets and Treats sales by 10% from the previous year will receive this award.

This award is given to the Service Unit Cookie Manager for their dedication to the Cookie Product Program. Managers that increase their overall cookie sales by 10% from the previous year will receive this award.

Volunteers may receive these awards more than once.

Resourceful Recruiter

This award is given to a volunteer who has gone above and beyond in recruiting new girls and adults into Girl Scouts.

Award can be earned more than once

Years of Service



To recognize years of Girl Scout Membership.

This includes Girl and Adult years.

Volunteers with more than 20 years of membership will be recognized by our CEO.

Be a registered troop leader or service team member
Attend or be represented at 75% of SU Leader meetings
Attend a Service Unit activity
Participate on a Service Unit activity committee
Previously been awarded Blue Service to Girls Award
