

Quick Reference Guide to Daycare Winter Weather/Illnesses Protocol

C&C Helping Hands

Snow or Adverse Weather

Childcare will remain open unless power goes out or conditions are deemed unsafe for the children to be in care.

If, at any point during care, power is lost or conditions are unsafe parents will be called to pick up their children immediately.

Should the childcare become inhabitable in a disaster, our offsite locations to go to are Woodinville Library and Cottage Lake Elementary. We will choose one of these locations dependent on which we can get to and if conditions are safe for us to stay there. We will notify families of our location as soon as we are able to do so.

Illness/COVID-19

Please call ***Carolyn at 425-409-4680*** if your child will not attend childcare due to illness. If you are unsure if your child should come or not, please call.

Any person who exhibits flu-like symptoms (primarily fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, cough and shortness of breath) should not be at childcare. Sick individuals should stay home and away from others and contact their health care provider.

If a child should become ill during the day, you will be notified immediately and will be expected to pick up the child as soon as possible. In such event, we will reasonably prevent contact between the ill child and other children until you arrive.

Should we need to close the childcare due to a COVID-19 case, the closure will be determined based on multiple factors. This will include the number of cases and the number and types of exposure that other individuals in the childcare may have had. A closure could last anywhere from a few days up to a few weeks, depending on the circumstances.

Please note, that you are required to pay for childcare during any closures (weather or illness/COVID-19) and any time your child is not in care.
