This trip will take us directly into the lives of mothers who have been trapped in the snares of the sex industry. These women are hearing, often for the first time, that Christ deeply loves them. Their children are vulnerable to poverty, gang activity, and the very same cycles of brokenness. We are part of them, being given opportunities that can change their futures.

One of our planned outreaches is to take these children and their moms to the local Children's Museum, followed by pizza. It may sound simple, but for them it is truly an opportunity of a lifetime. It is an escape from danger, a day of joy, and a glimpse of God's love in action. We will cover the costs of transportation, museum admission, and lunch.

We will also minister at Ebenezer School with Bible lessons, crafts, and a pizza party for all the students. As part of this, we hope to bless the teachers with gifts that remind them they are seen and valued.

Our goal is to raise \$1,500 to cover the week's mission activities. Any additional support will go toward other mission needs in Honduras, Haiti, and wherever God calls us.
