Serving with Ebenezer School

One of the great joys of this trip will be serving with Ebenezer School. This school is doing more than educating children. It is helping form young lives in the light of Christ.

At Ebenezer, we will share Bible lessons, crafts, games, encouragement, and love with the students. We also want to encourage the indigenous Christian leaders who are faithfully serving their own community. These men and women understand the language, culture, needs, and hopes of their people in ways no outside mission team ever could.

Our role is to come alongside them. To strengthen them. To remind them that they are seen, loved, and supported by brothers and sisters in Christ.



Why We Work with Women of Hope

We will also continue our partnership with Women of Hope, a ministry that serves women and families impacted by the sex industry.

This work matters deeply to us because the gospel is not only a message for Sunday morning. It is good news for the wounded, the exploited, the trapped, and the forgotten. Jesus came to proclaim freedom to captives, recovery to the broken, and redemption to those the world has used and discarded.

Through Women of Hope, we want to help share the gospel of freedom and redemption with women who need to know that their lives are not defined by what has happened to them. They are made in the image of God. They are loved by Christ. They are invited into healing, dignity, and new life.

We also have the privilege of pouring Scripture, love, attention, and joy into their children. These children need to know that they are precious to God. They need to hear the songs of faith, the stories of Jesus, and the steady message that they are loved, seen, and not forgotten.

Ministry in the Hurricane-Rebuilding Community

We will also serve in a community formed by families who were displaced or deeply affected by the dangerous hurricanes of 2020. Many of these families have endured loss that most of us can hardly imagine.

Our team will bring Bible teaching, crafts, games, and a skit for the children. We want the day to feel like a small VBS, filled with joy, laughter, Scripture, and personal care. Sometimes a game, a craft, a snack, or a simple moment of attention becomes a doorway through which a child experiences the love of Christ.

We are praying that our time there will be more than a program. We are praying it will be a witness.
