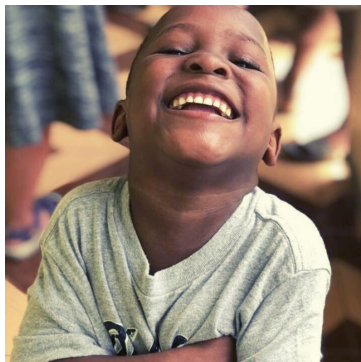

This year has brought about a lot of adjustments for financial and security reasons. The nation has been in total chaos for over six months, and we have prayerfully continued with your faithful support to meet the needs of those entrusted in our care. We tread lightly with words like chaos, but that is where Haiti is presently and we are doing everything possible to survive these circumstances with faith and hope - much of which your prayers supply and God multiplies.

We are not in a crisis food situation today but uncertain for the months and years ahead. We are praying and trusting God for an answer to that prayer. We know that the solution will be out of the box and require faith, but with His strength and your prayers and support, we have met the challenges of the year. God's grace us abundant and evident in these trying times...

Some students have been able to resume school, though it is different. They are typically not in uniform and not all teachers are present. In addition, many do not have all the required learning resources like books. This is not a funding issue. It is a safety and lack of supply issue. Our hearts are burdened that students are not in school for many reasons, some being that many of the students depend on the meal at school for their nutrition. Without the schools meeting that need it has been an increased burden on the ministry to try and ensure that we are providing assistance to the community during this difficult season.

The elderly, widows/widowers, and other vulnerable individuals we care for receive monthly support from the ministry. This looks different for each family, as they all have unique needs. Our staff regularly checks on everyone and stays in communication with us regarding specific needs as they arise.

Haiti and her people are tired, hurting, and in desperation. We wait in hope and anticipation of the Lord's work in Haiti. We know that we have been stretched, molded, and reshaped during this season. We have seen our staff step out and up in faith. They have risen above every challenge and continued to serve.

Matthew 25 Residents

The Matthew 25 House took on new shape during the course of the past year. We were able to successfully reunite some residents with their family and continue to support them through our Galatians 6:2 program. We currently have seven residents. Six are elderly and one is a disabled young man. Due to safety and supply shortages, they all live on our mission compound. This allowed us to combine resources and no travel is required to serve them daily.

The need for food, fuel, and medical care was at a critical level in 2022 and beyond. The ministry has given out direct food support and financial assistance. We invested into the community gardens and assisted in providing safe drinking water.



School Sponsorship

We provided 89 scholarships for students to attend school. The gang control of the nation made it very difficult for students to be in regular attendance. Some schools were able to function more often than others and many of the university students stayed on campus.

Home Builds

Building homes provide so much more than an organized pile of bricks. Building homes provide employment to the laborers, the material suppliers, and a safe secure home to sleep at night in the midst of chaos. We completed 2 home builds, 4 major repairs, and rented 11 homes for families.

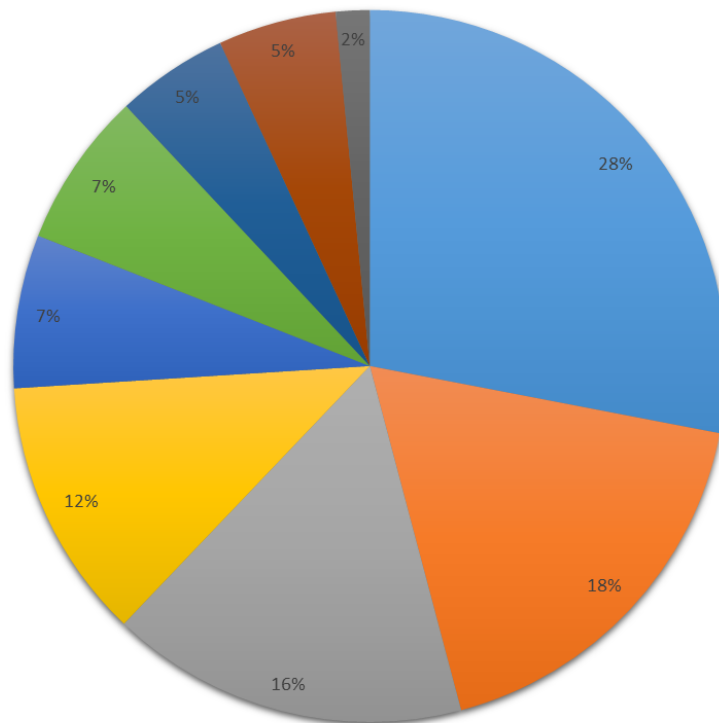
