Sharing our hearts...

On Saturday October 16th, sixteen United States Citizens and one Canadian Citizen, five were children were kidnapped in the area of Ganthier commune east of the country's capital, Port-au-Prince. They were visiting an orphanage on Saturday as part of their work for Christian Aid Ministries.

Our hearts are grieved by this most recent tragedy. In many ways it hits home for so many, because they are foreigners. However, the reality of this event is that is has become the daily life for our Haitian brothers and sisters.

In addition to these kidnappings it is estimated that over 600 people have been kidnapped since January 2021. The desire to find a better life had an estimated 28,000 Haitians under the bridge Del Rio, Texas near the United States-Mexico border last month. Around 7,200 migrants had been deported to Haiti as of October 7. President Jovenel Moïse was assassinated at his home on July 7. There was a deadly earthquake killed 2,200 people a month later. This does not include the Covid-19 pandemic effects, the rain and winds, the increase in gang activity, cost of living, decrease in security, and the emotional weight of instability.

Supply and Multiply has taken a number of steps to increase our security protocols. Many of these steps cannot be discussed publicly because doing so would potentially jeopardize their effectiveness. This includes limiting social media details of ministry activities and travel. Please note that posts are not in real time, though they are real. We asked that you comment, share, and encourage, but please leave specific details off of social media. We also have and will postpone travel if it is deemed necessary to do so. We long for the day when we can travel more freely and when people can meet and experience the ministry, the beautiful nation of Haiti, and her people.

We need prayer warriors! We need people, small groups, and churches to commit to praying for Haiti and her stability.

We daily are trusting God for His protection and provision. In Haiti, we continue to pour encouragement and resources into the greatest hope we can offer, the hope of Jesus Christ. Supply and Multiply has a God-calling and an equally matched commitment to remain faithful through every season of life in Haiti.
